Will Construction Case The will of Rev. Father Gleeson deceased late Parish Priest of Aglish was the subject of a construction suit in which Rev. Fr. E. McGrath, P. Edward Fitzgerald, foreman for Mr. Crisp, said that while Lenihan worked with them he never complained that he could not do any of the work at all.

John Cunningham an employee of respondent said that Lenihan did the normal work after the accident except milking the cows.

His Lordship giving judgment held that applicant was partially incapacitated by the accident and he found that his pre-accident weekly earnings were £3 6d and as he would now be able to earn only 30/- a week he awarded him compensation at the rate of 28/- a week as from December 1st last.
