



Farmers are therefore, strongly urged to make provision for THEIR OWN requirements of animal feeding stuffs for next Winter and Spring by growing on their own land quantities of Potatoes, Oats and Ymer feeding Barley, fully sufficient to cover their own requirements for whatever stock they propose to carry in the Autumn and Winter of 1950 and the Spring of 1931

NOTE Ymer Barley will not thrive in the absence of lime and fertilisers Farmers should, therefore, have their soil tested by their Agricultural Instructor and arrange to apply sufficient amounts of Lime, Phosphates, Potash and Nitrogen, if the soil analysis indicates any shortage of these essential elements
