



How To Get Big Arms to show your muscle he naturally ed the popularity of the de-to show your muscle he naturally ed the popularity of the de-means the bump on your up-ceased Rev T V Dunphy CC. means the bump on your upper arm known to physical culturists as your biceps. The biceps is one of the very easiest muscles to develope and when properly developed it is a source of pride to its possessor The biceps is not the only muscle that makes the upper arm look big Its antagonist or the muscie at the opposite side of the arm known as the triceps greatly adds to the size of the arm We will however take the musc es separately and we will start with a little specialised work for the

The best method for develop ing the biceps or any muscle for that matter is by applying re-sistance. This resistance can be your own body-weight strandlucky enough to possess barbells I will give you a few exercises

The first of these exercises is known as CHIN-UP It will be easy for you to find a beam of some sort so that you can reach up and catch hold of it with both hands with knuckles away from you Get a fairly narrow grip should be a beaut about a part. grip about shoulder width apart From the description of the name you will get the perform-ance of the exercise All you have to do is pull steadily with both hands until your chin touches the beam You will find you cannot perform many repetitions at first so begin by touching the floor with your feet every time you leave yourself down tions in this manner Next week I will tell you a few
