The Municipal Election - Mr Michael Dowling, Deputy Returning Officer, fixed Friday, Sept 8th as the date for receiving nominations for the Waterford Corporation Election on September 20th. So far little interest has been shown in the election.

Classes At Technical Institute Overcrowded - The Day Classes Central Technical Institute Parnell Street for Session 1950-51, opened on Monday, Sept 7th when there was a big influx of new pupils. One hundred and twenty boys sat for the Entrance Examination held on Friday, September 1st.

Developing The Arms There are only a limited number of exercises without apparatus in a suit position. One of the best of these is the 'Chinning the Bar' and climbing ropes will add a little bulk to the biceps so concentrate on these two.

Now we come to the other important muscles of the upper arm - 'the triceps'. The best exercise without apparatus is 'Floor Dipping'. Place your hands on the floor with the feet in a suit position. Bend the arms and allow the body to touch the floor. Push up again until the arms are straight. This movement should be repeated about 15 or 20 times. The exercise is made harder by raising the feet off the floor. The higher you raise the feet the harder the exercise becomes. Do not change the position of the feet until you have performed 15 repetitions in the suit position.
