Greyhound Racing At Youghal

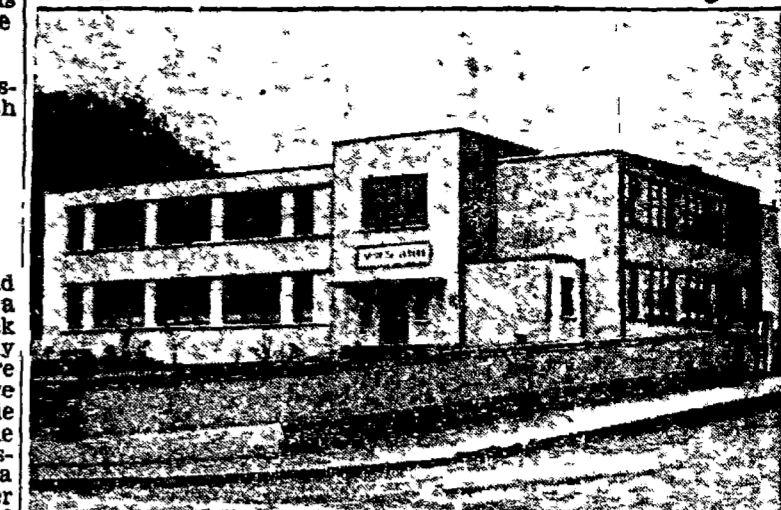
