



Were it not for the voluntary service of our President Michael Clancy the Band would not be in existence today However he did not have sufficient time to give to the training of new members For a successful Brass and Reed Band, it is absolutely necessary to have a class under instruction For work of this kind the service of a permanent Bandmaster is essential Time and again the Committee tried to get a Bandmaster but failed You are probably aware that the Committee has now secured a competent Bandmaster named Michael McCarthy During the short time that he is in Dungarvan it is evident that he is doing good work with the personnel of the Band He has different classes of new members who are being taught the theory of music and a knowledge of the different instruments. In time we hope to have these members actual players in the Band This year the personnel of the Band was so small that it was impossible without outside help to fulfill engagements

You have probably noticed in the local papers that the County Waterford Vocational Education Committee were unanimous about including a class of instrumental music in its school curriculum | This Committee is prepared to engage Mr McCarthy as a part time Teacher and is awaiting the sanction of the Department of Education Such a step is very important for the Band Committee, as it would help to supply players for our local Band

Now that the Band Committee has secured a Bandmaster, it is faced with financial difficulties It has to pay at least a part time salary to Mr McCarthy At the present value of money such a salary will be a great drain on its funds The amount subscribed yearly up to now would not be sufficient to pay a part time Bandmaster You, people of Dungarvan and Abbeyside are most anxious to keep our local Brass and Reed Band in existence Hence you will agree that the Band. Committee will need substantial Funds to attain this end On Sunday next November 19th the Band Committee is holding its Annual Collection for the upkeep of our local Band, at the gates of the Parish Church, the Friary Church and Abbeyside Parish Church You have always subscribed generously towards these Funds, but this year, the Band Committee is making a very special appeal for a greater response We wish to thank you very sincerely for your kindness in the past
