Co. Waterford Vocational Education Committee. Hopes Of Obtaining Mobile School Now Rather Faint.

Delay In Sanction Blamed. Instrumental Music Class For Cappoquin.

Very Rev T Canon O'Brien P.P.F. Chairman presided at the monthly meeting of the Co. Waterford Vocational Education Committee held in Dungarvan on Monday last.

This was passed and it was agreed to hold a 2-hour class once a week on Wednesday nights to start on Teachers Insurance For Part Time Teachers.

A resolution from Dun Laoghaire requested the Minister to exclude by special exclusion order those lowly paid temporary teachers who do not derive their main source of livelihood from teaching vocational classes from having to pay insurance.
