Preparation for these crops must be undertaken NOW, in addition to such other crops as farmers may intend to sow, such as wheat, industrial barley, beet and other root crops

Unless each furmer produces on his own land all the animal feed he requires, he cannot hope to maintain his livestock

It is for the farmers to decide whether freedom or compulsion is the better policy


