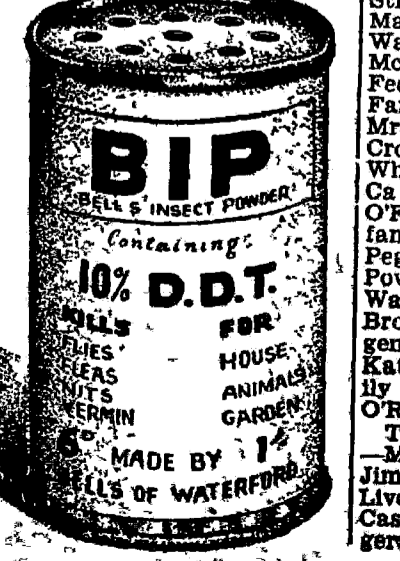

Dungarvan U. D. C. Town Hall Repairs Will Cost £8,000 Plan No. 2 Approved House Lettings And Rent Increases

Mr T Lannen, Chairman, presided at the usual meeting of the Dungarvan U.D.C. held at the Town Hall, on last Friday

The usual license members of the Architect had submitted two sketch plans of the proposed improvements to the Town Hall

The Clerk stated that the revenue from vessels taking water last year was £30 Several members held that the proposed extension was unnecessary

It was decided to adjourn the matter and get a further report from the Engineer as to the necessity of the extension

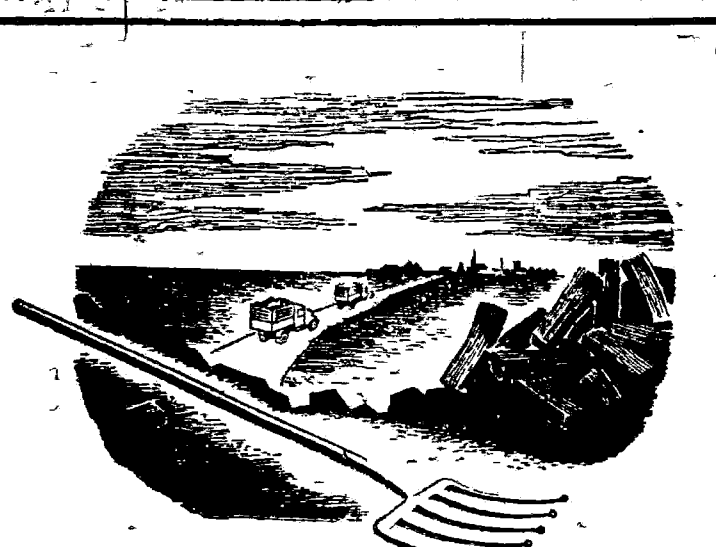
