the road from many of them farmers handle substantial supplies which they send to their neighbours. At the story I enquired why it was that they had such difficulty in getting a supply of milk if it was in the area in such large quantities. I was told that the farmers were not allowed to sell milk and for fear of being caught, few of them would not sell as much as a pint. The farmers believed that to sell the milk would be an offence so did the people and so it had to be got where it was in their own eyes, legal to get it—at a registered dairy.
