A SAD STORY
Two small children were playing in their garden in Abbey-side Dungarvan, recently. The little boy had his pedal motor car while the little girl had her bicycle. In their own care-free world of make-believe they enjoyed themselves. When tea-time came they rushed indoors forgetting to take their precious little toys with them. Some time later the children's parents wondered where the toys were and questioned the little ones about them. They replied that they had left them outside in the garden.

The mother went out to get them but there was no sign of them—they had disappeared. A thorough search of the area failed to locate them. And so today two little children are without their favourite playthings all because of someone's dishonesty.

Such is the sad story I found in my rambles this week.

CO LIBRARIAN GIVES THE FACTS

THE STORY OF A CO WATERFORD HOLY WELL
From all parts of County Waterford people suffering from various ailments are at present making their way to a holy well situated on the mountains in the parish of Aglish, at a place called Toor where hundreds of cures have been reported during the past few months.

From information to hand it is only the beginning. By now most of you will have taken careful note of the interesting news-story which appeared in a Sunday National paper entitled 'Motors Pay To Keep Alcohol Incentives Going'. I feel sure that many of you will have read and took notice when this amazing disclosure appeared in print. The Central Bank has been making headlines a great deal lately and once again it took Jim Dillon ex-Minister for Finance to tell the financial brains of the country a thing or two. You bank your money, if you are lucky enough to have any these big brains come along and invest it, not in Ireland, mind you but in Britain and further afield and the investments prove of great value to the country in which they are made. These countries make progress on Irish money while Ireland according to Mr. Dillon's remarkable disclosures, must stand back and even fade into insignificance through a course of slow decay.

In the blessed waters of this little well on the mountainside the offerings made there in the form of medals and other articles are collected by Mr. John Dower Mongally, Toor, who lives near by and these are later handed over to the local Masses for the purpose of having Masses offered.

Although the well has been there while memory serves, it is only lately it has attracted such numbers of people. The history of the well is very dim but it is legendary that when St. Declan was on his way to Ardmore from Drumore near Cappoquin, where it is recorded he first saw the light of day he stopped and rested on the mountainside at a place called Toor. When he lay down he had a longing for a drink of water but there was little chance of getting any there near and he was too exhausted to go on any further. As he lay down his outstretched hand rested on soft ground and within a few minutes he felt cold water ooze up between his fingers. Thus a clear spring was born to refresh the Saint who in his gratefulness to his Master ordained that all who should partake of its waters would be restored to health and strength to continue their journey through life.

Many of the older residents of the area say that the waters of the well have given new life to many throughout the years and at all times of the year since St. Declan first drank from it. St. Declan's arrival in Ardmore preceded the arrival of St. Patrick and it is of interest to note that when St. Patrick did come back to Ireland he never entered, or at least never evangelised the important territory of the Decies. Neither is he recorded to have sent missionaries into the Decies or to have committed it to any of his disciples. The previous preaching of Declan supplies the reason. Christianity had already found entrance and made progress, and Patrick, who had many devoted disciples still awaited had no time for preaching to the already converted.

St. Augustin died on the 9th August around the 5th century and was buried in the old cemetery at Ardmore where later on a little church or primitive oratory which still survives, was erected over the grave.

Today the flame of Christianity first brought into Ireland by St. Declan burns more brightly than ever before in his own loved place and once again through his holy name.

God bless you little emblem, what thoughts you bring to me. Of the happy days in childhood when a boy I wandered free from Knockmeadow to Erdeside, and from Kilbrete to Glenmore.

The Sun is shining brightly all things are looking gay. The bands once more are playing the strains of Patrick's day. The boys are sleeping shamrock, all but me my heart feels sore.

ARDMORE GOSSIP An Angler's Paradise—The following story brings before the people of this area the name of a young man who spent some time on holidays here with his father and family. He is Gerald V. Coughlan a native of Youghal and brother of Mr. Kevin Coughlan Ardmore and local beet loading agent and Chairman of the Ardmore Branch Irish Labour Party. He is also brother of Rev. Brother Coughlan Waterpark College, Waterford and of Rev. Sister M. Coughlan of a Birmingham convent. The following story is a true fishing story from two original cuttings—one from an English Sunday paper and the other from the American "Saturday Evening Post".

The English paper stated that Mr. Coughlan's speciality was catching large fish with light tackle. Mr. Coughlan resides in New Jersey and a holiday here for the past three years goes on a fishing expedition to Florida and has always returned with angling honours. In 1949 he hooked and landed a 115 lb. tarpon in 35 minutes. In 1950 he landed a 160 lb. tarpon (the record) in 35 minutes and in this present year he hooked and killed a 124 lb. tarpon in 55 minutes.

Outside this feat we understand that for four out of the past six years (three in succession) Mr. G. Coughlan, has won the outstanding angling achievement award at the Metropolitan Miami Fishing Tournament, which is the greatest event of its kind in the United States.

The tarpon before it is safely landed jumps many times as high as 15 feet over the surface of the water, and such is the reason Mr. Coughlan stated that sportsmen love to pit themselves against him.

The article concludes by adding that it needs arms and wrists of steel as well as deep knowledge of the ways of the fish to bring them back as Mr. Coughlan has done. Mr. Coughlan's story runs developed both during his Irish boyhood, fishing streams for trout, rivers for salmon, and the sea for striped bass.

Mr. Coughlan was born at Youghal, Co. Cork, he is son of the late Commander William Coughlan, and when he heard about fishing on the Florida coast in shallow water with the same type of equipment, he decided to try it and was successful from the first, and has done it ever since.

In an interview Mr. Coughlan related that after crossing from America he did a lot of angling in Canada, which offers the best selection of fresh water fishing on the North American Continent, and when he heard about fishing on the Florida coast in shallow water with the same type of equipment, he decided to try it and was successful from the first, and has done it ever since.

He was a popular farmer in the Curragh district and Youghal a keen interest in courting. He received his early education at the Christian Brothers' Youghal and has travelled much. He held the rank of Capt. in the Irish Army and he was a track star and mile and half runner and a champion of Ireland and competed in the Olympic Games of 1928. He went to USA with the Olympic team in 1932. His wife is an American girl and they have two sons and a daughter. By profession Mr. Coughlan is a successful manufacturer of Chemicals.
