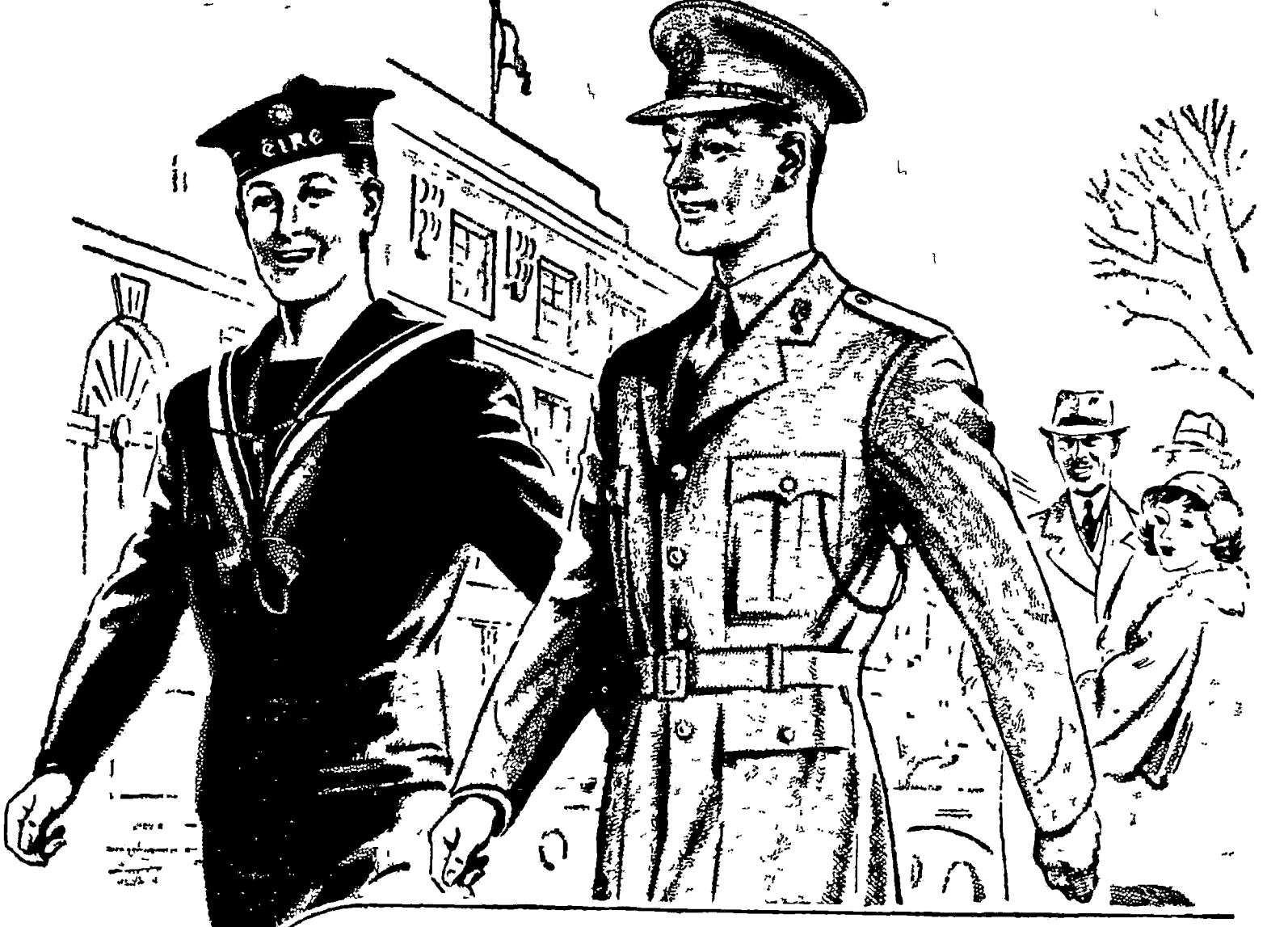

Brief History Of The Presentation Order At the beginning of the nineteenth century the town of Dungarvan in common with most other towns and villages in Ireland, was without a single Catholic school

and gratefully availed of by young and old Two of the postulants had been sent to the Waterford Convent to serve their novitiate and on their return as professed Sisters in 1814 the Community whose numbers had been increased by the entrance of Anne Draper and Mary Fennell in 1810
