





Blight Prevention In Potato Crops

No crop in our system of cultivation suffers such spectacular and drastic destruction by disease as the potato crop which is not protected against

The disease appears suddenly almost spontaneously in some quarter or another at this time of the year and in damp cloudy weather conditions becomes widespread from a focal point becomes of infection in a matter of hours Potato blight has already made its appearance in coastal areas and is tending to

spread inland All crops should now be protected by a first spraying and further sprayings should be given from time to time to protect new growth and to keep the crop growing during the


Method of preparing Spray It is important to use the correct amounts of Bluestone and Washing Soda in the mak ing up of the spray The standard or 2% mixture is made up by dissolving 8 lbs of Bluestone in a vessel containing about 35 gallons of water In a separate vessel containing 4 or 5 gallons of water dissolve 10 lbs of Washing Soda-crystals The washing soda solution should then be added slowly and with constant stirring to the Blue-stone solution to make 40 gallons of spray ready for 1mme A full topped crop would require 120 gallons of spray per acre as it is the effiwetting of the foilage which gives protection A half standard or 1% spray using 4 lbs of Bluestone and 5 lbs of Washing Soda per 400 gailons Kitchen and Diningroom Chairs of water will protect very young crops applied at around 100 gallons per acre


