A GALLANT CHAMPION RETIRES

PETE CROTTY BIDS GOOD-BYE TO BOXING RING. One of Ireland's greatest boxers has hung up his gloves and at his home in Lackanueen Dungarvan, he has on display many valuable reminders of a record that is glorious in the sporting history of the Irish Amateur Boxing Association.

Pete Crotty, who for the past four years has held the Irish Welterweight title in Irish amateur boxing has retired undefeated and from the ring steps down gallant champion in every sense of the word.

Few know the story behind the many thrilling exhibitions of Pete Crotty—the young welterweight who first took the headlines as champion Armorer during the Emergency years and who soon became known as Ireland's Iron Man.

Pete Crotty had been attached to St. Mary's Young Club Clonmel for many years. He was a Dungarvan man without a home club who spent most of his spare time in training at the F.C.A. Hall, Dungarvan.

He fought in Italy, in England in America on the Golden Gloves European Team and represented the Green, White and Gold at the Olympic Games in Helsinki in July, 1952.

He fought in America in 1951. Pete was defeated by the Los Angeles boxer Alvin Karpis in the same boxer visited Ireland the following year (April 26th 1952) as a member of the American Golden Gloves selection touring Europe.

It was really heartbreaking for the many Dungarvan supporters because following their first clash with Kilrossanty, high hopes were held of their returning to victory in the County Final this year.

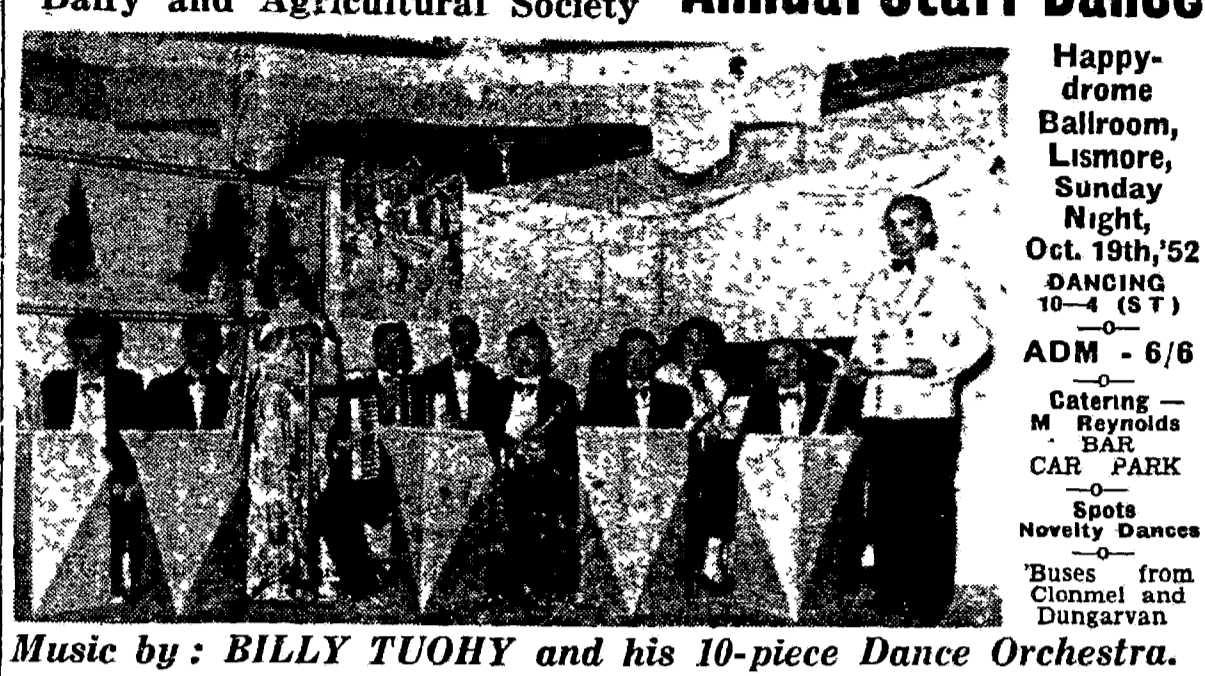
The game was refereed by Mr. Moss Colbert, Cork, who kept all matters well under control in a manner that won for him the admiration of players and spectators alike.
