COUNTY WATERFORD COMMITTEE OF AGRICULTURE

SCHEME FOR THE DESTRUCTION OF FOXES, 1953

As from 1st January, 1953 and until further notice the above Committee have adopted the following Scheme for the Destruction of Foxes in County Waterford viz:

Conditions of Scheme.
 1. The following awards to be given:—£1 for each Cub Dog or Vixen.

2. Every applicant for an award must take the head and brush of each fox in respect of which he claims an award to the nearest Garda Station and there complete a Form of application, which when certified by the Garda Sergeant must be forwarded by the applicant to the Committee's Office. The tongue of the fox must be removed in the presence of the Garda Sergeant.

3. Payment of awards will be made only for foxes killed in the following mountain areas—Ballynamult Ballyduff Ballymacbray Cappoquin Dungarvan Ballybrien Lismore Ballymacmack Lismore.

4. The completion of the certificate on the application form does not necessarily entitle the applicant to an award. It is a condition that an additional payment of 5/- per dog or vixen (cubs excluded) killed in the mountain areas of the county, applicants should have their application forms signed by the Garda.
