

Passing Of Dungaryan's Revered

The death occurred unexpected Stedly at Parochial House Dun to garvan in the early hours of saturday morning last January 10th of Very Rev Thomas Canon OBrien PP VF. Canon OBrien PP VF.
The late Canon OBrien was
out and about his duties on
Friday although he had not been in the best of health for some time past, but nevertheess, he went about his daily tasks always cheerfully and ever willing to help out He was truly a friend of the people and took a very keen interest in everything that concerned his parish For twenty years he was Parish Priest in Dungarvan and during that time he saw many changes mainly for the better He played a major part in making several of them possible and right up to the time of

his lamented passing, the took an active part in affairs The late Canon O Brien was particular favourite with the children of the parish and they were his greatest joy At all times no matter how great the occasion, he always had a word for the tiny-tots He took a special interest in the progress of local industry and was closely associated with same To both employee and employer he was ever willing to render his valuable advice and help and in many local labour disputes it was his careful and understanding handling of difficult situa-tions that brought about satisfactory settlements His way with both sides made him the good friend and confidant of

both and their respect for him could not have been higher Since the first day he came into Dungarvan Very Rey Canon OBrien made available his services to one and all His charity to those in need was far beyond measure and to the poor of the town his loss will be

certainly very great In spiritual affairs Very Rev Canon O'Brien was a saintly personality whose efforts bore much fruit He was a leading Churchman whose sermons at all times reflected clearly his brilliant understanding of his

A Nation without a language is a nation without a soul 'The revival of our native tongue is more important than any other single political prob-lem You have heard these and similar statements many times on the lips of politicians Are they catch-cries to trade on our Irish idealism or have the words some significance in their own right? Whatever the motives for their utterance the words do mean something and they mean

a great deal Nationalism in our case this sense we have of being Irish is not a simple thing It is a complex and subtle feeling made up of various factors. 
