Protest Over High Charges For Town Hall

Deputation From Caseyville Tenants

"No use Beautifying Streets While There's Starvation In Houses"

Mr T Lannen Chairman presided at a meeting of the Dungarvan Urban District Council held on last Friday night.

High Prices Will Mean Boycott

Mr Walsh referred to an order by the Manager fixing the charge for dances to 4 am at the Town Hall at £30 (including light deposit hire of piano and supervision of amplifier) with an additional £5 for New Year's Night, Easter Sunday, Night Whit, Sunday August Sunday and St Stephen's Nights.

These charges he said, were very high and it would be very hard for smaller clubs to pay them.

Mr Lee—Those charges are up against the workman and they are unfair.

Mr McCarthy—The prices mean a boycott on the hall and you can ask anyone in town about that. If the hall would be let at the old charges all clubs would be applying for it but now they can't. It's as plain as ABC that the Manager wants the dances in some other place. The boycott on the hall has been going on for the past 3 years and there's another move on, and I think it's most unfair.

Mr Walsh—This is a case of killing the goose that lays the golden egg.

Senator Butler—The matter is a Managerial function.

Mr Casey—Will the Clerk tell us what the annual repayments on the loan for the hall repairs will be?

Clerk—Around £1 400.

Mr McCarthy—I think if we got £15 a night we'd be doing very well.

Mr Lee—That hall will now be just for a certain class and not the working-class club in town is paying £65 for the opening night.

Chairman—The town must get back the money spent on the hall in some way.

Mr Walsh—That's what we're afraid about with the high prices people won't book the hall.

Mr Casey—Is it true that there were a number of bids over £40 for the opening night?

Clerk—Yes, there were four altogether one at £65 two at £40 and one at £20.

Mr Keane gave it as his opinion that the new prices will overtax the hall and he agreed with the remarks of Mr McCarthy and Mr Walsh. There has been "a hidden hand behind the Town Hall business from the very start and that is apparent from the struggle we had to make here to even get the work done. I think as this is one of the most important matters for the town that a special meeting should be held to discuss it and at which the Manager would be present. It is a serious matter." Mr Keane then went on to say that there was a lack of civic spirit in the town.

Mr Casey—I challenge you on that.

Mr Keane—Sure every Tom Dick and Harry is going outside the town now for things that can be easily bought in it. How long can men expect to remain in employment while this goes on were it not for your late brother Mr Casey this town would be a shambles as there's nothing in it now only the Leather Factory.

Mr Keane said that the local Trades Council had appealed to the people recently to support local enterprise. With regard to the charges for the Town Hall what had been said but Mr Butler had got to the kernel of the matter when he said that it was a Managerial function. He thought that before the charges had been fixed that the Manager would have asked for the Council's opinion. "When there's a dirty job to be done he will refer it to the Council all right but not one like this," he added.

Mr Keane—I asked for co-operation from the officials before but did we get it?

Mr McCarthy—If we don't get it then we should leave here in a body and never come back. We should nominate our prices and send them to the Manager. Chairman—I for one will not leave with any body and I think we should give the charges a trial.

Mr McCarthy—These prices on the hall are a boycott.

Chairman—We must get the money back.

Mr McCarthy—Sure it had to be spent or the hall would fall down.

Chairman—Oh no it would not.

Mr Kelly—I agree with the Chairman the Town Hall was good enough without these repairs.

Mr Keane—If so why then did you vote to spend the money?

Mr Kelly—Well now you have caught me on the wrong foot.

Senator Butler—I'd like to know how many will be allowed to dances at the Town Hall according to the regulations of the Fire Officer.

Chairman—It would be better not to deal with that point.

Senator Butler—Sure will come out in court anyway. What I want to find out is are the charges reasonable. With five dances at five shillings each the amount collected would be £100 and the expenses would not be more than that even with the hall at £30 and there probably would be 500 or 600 dancers at a dance.

Chairman—Mr Keane has suggested a special meeting to fully discuss the matter.

Mr Keane said that the charges for other halls within a radius of 10 or 15 miles should be ascertained for that meeting.

Senator Butler—What I want to see is that the income from the hall will meet its outgoings so that it will not be a burden on the rates.

Mr Keane—I think Mr Keane's suggestion is a fair and reasonable one and all the facts and figures about the hall should be available for the special meeting.

To Mr Walsh the Clerk said that the charges for short dances would be £8.

The discussion then ended and the matter was deferred to a special meeting.

Deputation From Shandon Messrs Lyons Duggan and Egan of Shandon came before the meeting and complained about the disgraceful condition of the footpaths at Shandon.

Mr Lyons said that they were like people who were not living in the town at all as there was no means on them. Good footpaths had been taken up and replaced elsewhere in town but nothing was done at Shan-

don where the paths were really bad.

All the members agreed with the deputation, and as the matter was one for the County Council the repairs were recommended to them.

The members of the deputation also complained about the terrible condition of their houses, and the meeting decided to have the report of the Health Inspector on the houses before them for the next meeting.

Starving Tenants In Beautiful Houses

Eighteen tenants from the new Dr Caseyville housing scheme came before the meeting to protest against the continued high rents of the houses and calling on the Council to reduce the rents to bring them within the means of the tenants.

Spokesman for the deputation who crowded into the small meeting room, was Mr Liam Kelly who asked what had happened to the motion of the Council which had been passed to put 1/- on the rates to reduce the rents.

The Chairman said that the matter was a Managerial function and as far as he knew the resolution had been turned down by the Minister.

Mr Kelly said that he was passed unanimously here but I don't know what happened it after that.

The Clerk said that the resolution was sent to the Department for their observations last September but no reply had been received about it since.

Mr Keane—The blame rests with the Local Government Department so there mightn't be enough of them up there!

Chairman—There is and that's what is making all these schemes so dear.

Mr L Kelly said that he saw where it was proposed to spend £300 to grow trees for the village and he suggested that this be put to reducing the rents instead. There's no use in beautifying the outside, he said while there's starvation inside.

Mr Woods (another member of the deputation)—There's no need for trees up there because there'll be woods there before long. They're moving out already.

Mr Keane—We have a grand scheme at Abbeyside let a reasonable rents and it's a pity because we could have had the same up there.

Mr L Kelly said that there was one on the deputation who was in receipt of only 28 a week and he had a family of six and he was paying 11/9 rent a week. There were also several others in much the same circumstances.

Mr Keane—That scheme was not built for the workingman at all as the rents are far too high.

The Clerk told Mr Casey and Mr Kelly that the final certificate had not been given to the Contractor and that the Architect had visited all the houses for any complaints.

When Mr Kelly asked the Council what they now proposed to do, the Chairman again pointed out that the matter was one for the Manager.

Mr Kelly—Then maybe "he would receive the deputation."

Mr Woods—As far as I can see the only thing this Council can do is pass votes of sympathy.

Mr Casey said that he felt sure that the Manager would receive the deputation.

The Waterford County Officials Gaelic Club was registered in connection with Town Hall lettings.

Mr Keane said that when he objected he thought for a while that as "puffers" to push up the price of the hall but he had since satisfied himself that the club was genuine.

The Chairman agreed that the club was genuine and that an An Tostal Committee was also registered.

The Council agreed to accept subject to sanction 1000 procedures from the local Tostal Committee at a cost of £100.

With regard to the Council proposed to do in connection with the celebrations a recommendation was made that the Tostal Committee be given the Town Hall for the three Sunday nights after the opening night. The question of making a monetary contribution to the Committee was deferred to the next meeting.

In connection with the decoration and flood-lighting of the town it was stated that there was nothing suitable for flood-lighting, and the Chairman said that no decoration of the town was needed as it was a natural pretty town and one of the nicest in the country.

Loughmore—Change Of Name The Clerk stated that the rent collector had carried out a preliminary survey at Loughmore concerning Mr. Keane's proposal to have the name changed to Congress Villas. Of the 28 tenants nine were out when the rent collector called, and of the remaining 17 seven had said yes and the other 28 had been indifferent. This would mean that the four-sevenths required for the change was there but as the proposal was one to extend an existing name it might be as well to get the opinion of the existing Congress Villas.

Mr McCarthy suggested that the name might be changed to St. Patrick's Place, but Mr Lee objected, and said that it should be called Congress

Villas. The Council agreed to have the question referred to the Solicitor.

An Tostal—And Politics With regard to the Manager's suggestion discussed at the previous meeting that the £65 bid by the Flanna Fall Club for the opening night at the Town Hall be given to the Tostal Committee, the Clerk said that the Department had refused to sanction the suggestion.

Mr Walsh said that there were a few aspects in this matter that he wanted to have cleared up in view of what Mr Kelly said the last night. His statement that Flanna Fall had put in that bid to help out the Tostal Committee looked as if there had been collusion and underhand work going on and if it was correct then they should request the Manager for an explanation.

Mr Kelly objected to Mr Walsh's reference to underhand work. He said that there had been nothing underhand and if there was as Mr Walsh had said, he would like Mr Walsh to give proof of it.

Mr Kelly—If what you said the last night was true and if what the Manager did was a fact then there must have been collusion in the matter.

Mr Casey—All Mr Kelly said was that the reason they made the big bid was to help out the Tostal Committee.

Mr Kelly—Yes and if that is so it shows there must have been collusion.

Mr Casey—That was Mr Kelly's statement.

Mr Kelly—Yes, but was it true that's what we want to find out.

Mr Walsh—Yes we want to know whether it was true or untrue. Either the Manager did something which he should not have done or else the statement is untrue.

Mr Kelly—I'm a member of the Abbeyside Cumann and it was the Dungarvan Cumann that applied for the hall and how could I know what went on?

Mr Walsh—Then the statement you made the last night here was untrue and the big uneconomic bid put in by the Flanna Fall Club was a stab in the back.

Mr Kelly—The Tostal Committee, as £65, was put up to keep them from getting the hall for the first night.

Mr Kelly—The Manager was tempted by this outrageous bid which would simply gain a certain amount of political kudos.

Mr Walsh—The whole thing was a stab in the back by Flanna Fall to the Tostal Committee and the Tostal is a child of Flanna Fall.

Mr Casey—I categorically deny that.

Mr Walsh—It's obvious and it's only used by them when it suits them, but when it doesn't they drop like a brick.

Mr Casey said that Mr Walsh should withdraw his statement that An Tostal was political and that Mr Kelly said that he should also withdraw the statement that there had been underhand work.

Mr Walsh said that he would withdraw if Mr Kelly would say that the statement he made the last night was untrue.

Mr Kelly said that he would help An Tostal. He did not say that the local Tostal Committee was political but that An Tostal was sponsored by the Government.

The discussion then ended and the election of officers then took place.


