SPOTLIGHT ON THE UNKNOWN

OUR PLACE NAMES
Continuing my references to Canon Power's Place Names we next come to BALLYGARRAN. THE PROVOSTS LAND (i.e. of Lismore) the family name of O'Reachtair is still found in Co. Kilkenny. Inquisition taken in Tallon April 2nd 1604. Fines of lands of Ballygarran and the hamlets of the same are now and from time to the contrary of which memory of men does not exist always were known taken held, etc. as a waste in which the provost and his gesses (of Lismore) have a common for their cattle and plough there to pay annually to Sir Walter Raleigh 8d for every acre tilled and for pasture 10/- yearly with other labors and customs. The original O'Reachtair was presumably the archbishop or steward of the Lismore Church-lands. The meaning of Cappoquin is given as the 'Hillside Plot of Corn'. Reference to the old Cornerstone says—'this is a boulder of sandstone dear to the soul of every Cappoquin man and chips at Glenmalur have crossed the Atlantic to console many an exile's heart.' Coolnasmuttan means 'Corner of the Boggedal Stumps'. A note on Glenmalur states that this seems to be a modern fancy name as the Irish name was 'Balle an Gharrain'—'Grove Homestead'. The castle of Ballygarran which figured in 17th century wars stood on the site of present Glenmalur Abbey under which the river (Blackwater) is fordable for a horseman. Both Glenmalur and the neighbouring small townland of Ralph are now popularly known as 'Castlerichard'. A few pages further on we find reference to one who in his time bothered not with either law or order. The note says that this means 'Smooth Maurice's Glen' and Canon Power goes on to say that the individual commemorated here was an outlaw—probably a 'wild man' who made the glen on the east side of the townland of Glenmore his retreat.

also learned from her of the relationship between the de Fagés family and the family of the late Count Plunkett as the late Madame de Fagés whose maiden name was O'Sullivan was sister of old Count Plunkett's second wife. My final call was to Miss Longan at Abbeyside, where I had a chat with her and her sister Mrs. Dower and where I finally pieced the whole story together. The Longan family lived at South Terrace when the de Fagés came there at the turn of the century, and it would appear that Madame de Fagés was married in Madrid and had three children. When her husband died she returned to Ireland. The children were called 'Mimi', 'Tita' and 'Beca' by their intimate friends. They were an accomplished family and Mimi (Miriam) was an excellent violinist. Tita (Charlotte) appears to have returned to Madrid where she died at the very early age of 28 years in 1910 (as mentioned on the tombstone) and sometime after the family went to Glasgow from Dungarvan where old Madame de Fagés died in 1918. The other daughter joined a religious order and it is presumed that she also died. The remaining daughter, Miriam continued to reside in Glasgow and taught at the Franciscan Convent there until her retirement in 1937. She spent her annual holidays every year at Lourdes helping the sick and her death at the age of 75 years has now cut a last link with old Dungarvan of more than a generation ago. I am deeply grateful to the many people who helped me in my enquiries and the assignment of tracing the de Fagés connection was indeed a most pleasurable one for me.

RENTS OF HOUSES AT DR CASEVILLE
I understand that the County Manager with whom was the Town Clerk received the report from the tenants of Dr. Caseville concerning the rents of their houses on Saturday last. From what I can gather the County Manager informed them that the resolution passed by the Council last September approving of the imposition of a further shilling in the pound on the rates to reduce the rents was passed at a time when no work had been done for such a purpose but that if the Council agreed to have it included in the coming estimate it could now be done. I am further informed that inquiries were made at the Department in Dublin following representations by members of the deputation to Deputy O'Connell concerning the Council's September resolution and it is alleged that nothing was known at the time of the proposal at the Department. How true this is remains to be seen as the matter will be discussed at tonight's U.D.C. meeting when the deputation will again come before the meeting. Many Councillors will find themselves on the horns of a dilemma over this matter as while all agree that the rents are too high, they must also be considered that the burden of taxation has become almost unbearable.

LENTEEN PASTORAL 1953
Diocese Of Waterford And Lismore
APPEAL TO YOUTH
And may I address a special word of greeting and exhortation to the young men and young women the grown up boys and girls of the Diocese. The birth of each one of you my dear young friends was an occasion of great rejoicing and gladness in your home for joy that a new child was born into the family. And when each one of you was brought back home after being christened in the church mother kissed you as she received you back 'born again of water and the Holy Ghost in Baptism'. Mother knew that Our Lord in the Sacrament of Baptism had done great things in the soul of her little child. I ask you therefore, to live as becomes persons called by Our Lord to the vocation to be a Christian and to follow the path of holiness. I pray for you and I pray that you will say your morning and night prayers to assist thoughtfully and reverently at Sunday Mass to go to Confession and Holy Communion once a month and in general to aim high and to do well. These religious helps which were left to you by the Good Shepherd will work wonders in your minds hearts and souls. Be on your guard against drinking and gambling and vicious habits. This drinking of intoxicants may begin just as early as in childhood. Inexperienced youth thinks it is a big and a fine thing to be in the fashion but it tends to become an expensive and demoralising habit which may stick to one for life. Be on your guard against the habit of drinking. Therefore against intoxicating drink which tends to ruin homes to break the hearts of mothers and wives to spoil careers by neglected work and missed opportunities and to bring the greatest misery on the drunkard and all associated with him. You should have a sense of the sin and the shame of drunkenness and not regard it as a subject for joking or for boasting. The young man who refuses to take intoxicating drinks, shows that self-respect, dignity and sense of duty that should characterise citizens of a free country. Such a young man not only acts wisely for himself and takes his part in the struggle against a serious moral evil but he is helping to raise the standard of our national civilisation. Many homes are broken up or rendered unhappy by the effects of excessive drinking. Many more would be broken up but for the heroism of so many good and patient mothers who try to keep the home going in spite of great grief and suffering. Thoughtless husbands appear to lose all sense of responsibility and spend their time and money in public houses when they should be devoting themselves to the care of their wives and their children. My dear young people live in the grace of God which you received for the first time in Baptism. If you think you have lost the grace of God by sin go as soon as you can to Confession. Remember that Holy Communion is the special food for your soul left by Jesus Christ. Be determined to be honest and to be chaste. Try to get good knowledge of the Catholic Religion and in your daily work use the muscles of your body and your mind to the maximum. And may Our Lord and the Queen of heaven teach, bless and sustain you on the way that is serene and noble the way of the pure heart, that seeing God by faith here on earth, you may one day see Him forever in the Kingdom of His glory. Deputy Dillon's Question About Dungarvan Co-Op. In Dail
Deputy Jim Dillon former Minister for Agriculture in the Dail on Wednesday February 25th asked the Minister for Agriculture (Deputy T. Walsh) whether he was aware of any proposal to distribute bonus shares in the Dungarvan Co-operative Creamery to a limited number of existing shareholders and whether in view of the fact that this group of creameries was conveyed to the present Society by the Dairy Disposals Board some years ago he had approved of the issue of bonus shares on this restricted basis. The Minister in reply said that the answer to the first part of the question was in the negative and the second part of the question did not therefore arise.

Lismore Fishery Board Meeting
A meeting of the Lismore No. 4 Board of Conservators was held in the Grand Hotel, Fermoy Mr C. G. Annesley Chairman presiding.
Total Number of Salmon Killed
The total number of salmon killed by nets and traps for the opening month of the salmon season amounted to 1,357 and weighing 15,553 lbs. In addition by rod salmon numbering 174 of 1,844 lbs were also captured. These figures show a decrease of 268 lbs for the same period of last season. The average weight for all salmon killed was slightly over 11 lbs the above figures do not include salmon purchased by Messrs J. O'Neill Waterford along the tidal area or the rod returns of Mrs C. R. Millais, Carrigane Ballyduff. A discussion on the killing of salmon during the month of September was adjourned to the next meeting for consideration.
A report of the hatchery at Malloy was then considered. Mr T. P. Kenny said practically all the salmon ova at Malloy hatchery are now hatched out.

IN THE DAIL
DEPUTY T. A. KYNE, SPEAKING ON THE (SECOND STAGE) NATIONAL STUD BILL, 1953
Deputy Kyne. I would like to say that my Party are not averse to supplying money to improve our bloodstock industry. We realise that the National Stud has a commercial value. We also realise that it gives to this country a prestige which increases the value of racehorses bred in it. In opposing this Bill we do so not because we want to injure the National Stud but because we wish to say that now is not the time. With over 80,000 unemployed in Ireland we say that no Minister should offer to gamble away £250,000. It is for that reason that we in the Labour Party oppose this Bill. This country is too small. This country is too heavily taxed. To quote the Taoiseach it is groaning under taxation. Yet the Minister's family stands up and introduces a measure that is to pay away £250,000 for one single animal an animal that God forbid could be dead in the morning.
It is a strange thing to see that in this country a country groaning under taxation, a country with over 80,000 unemployed, can still afford to out-bid the richest country in the world for the purchase of a sire. Tulyar may improve the stock of this country. It is to be presumed he will but very little improvement will take place in the bloodstock of the very small breeder of this country. I have in my hand a paper dated the 29th January, 1952 showing a group of National Stud owners at a meeting in Dublin. You would be surprised if you would go through the names of these individuals, how very few have O'Hara's, or any other Irish names you would find

You will get Lieutenant-Colonel Major-Generals and other names like that of Tulyar will be confined to those stud Managers' nominees to the ascendancy people who are still remaining in Ireland. If the Minister for Agriculture takes pleasure in purchasing something for these people while there are 80,000 unemployed then I wish him well with it. The Minister has said that the horse breeding industry is responsible for an income of £3,000,000 per annum. That is quite correct but it is not correct to say that horse racing of itself is responsible for it. Included in that £3,000,000 is the money paid for old horses sent across to Belgium and to other countries to be killed to our eternal disgrace. It does not do to take the round figure of all horse prices in this country simply put it down on one side compare against that the price paid for Tulyar and try to adduce from that fact that it is a fair proposition. Whether or not Tulyar has been bought too dear whether or not the risk of racing him is one that should not be taken I do not propose to express an opinion. I have very little knowledge of horse breeding very little knowledge of horse racing and very little knowledge of horse betting. However I do say that as a protest against the present position in the name of the people of this country who are unemployed in my constituency I am prepared to vote against the Bill introduced by the Minister.
