Letter of advice

IN MOST districts the total rainfall for the past fourteen months has been little more than half normal As a result the amount of moisture in the soil is extremely low and difficulty may be experienced later in getting seed to germinate While the present dry period lasts the following steps to conserve soil moisture are urgently recommended on land intended for sugar beet

**GROWERS** 

Early ploughed land should not be tilled until immediately before sowing the beet crop

Late ploughed land should be relied and then st ghtly harrowed in order to produce a mulch

If weeds start growing they should be killed by a light

Second ploughing should not be carried out

A firm seed bed will be required this year and therefore cultivation before sowing should not be deeper than

Wherever possible, beet should be sown on the flat, otherwise sow in small drills well rolled

The above precautions are recommended even if a moderately heavy rainfall should occur during the next few weeks


