

An average of 12 tons of tops and crowns is produced from a 10 ton crop of washed sugar beet Twelve tons of tops and crowns have a feeding value equal to 18 tons of mangels They can be ensiled more cheaply than mangels can be clamped

One ton of Pressed Pulp sold to Beet Growers at £1 per ton ex Factory has a feeding value equal to 30 cwts of mangels

Dried Molassed Pulp allotted to Growers at the rate of 13 cwts per ton of beet delivered has a feeding value equal to oats The price is 12/- per cwt

All surplus pulp is sold to growers in addition to their ration

In addition to the cash value of the Sugar Beet crop it will give you the fodder you are accustomed to get from mangels and turnips
