APPEAL TO SHEEP OWNERS

MARKETING OF CLEAN WOOL

OIFIG AN AIRE TALMHAÍOCHTA (Office of the Minister for Agriculture) BAILE ATHA CLIATH

Now that shearing time is at hand, it is opportune for me to remind sheep-owners of their obligation under the Clean Wool Act, 1947, to ensure that the wool sold by them is clean and free from injurious substances.

The Act prohibits the branding of sheep with tar, pitch or paint incapable of being removed from the wool by "scouring", and requires that any wool on which such substances, or daggings, may be present shall be removed from the fleece before or during shearing. The Act also prohibits the purchase or sale of wool on which tar, pitch, paint or daggings may be present.

The reputation of Irish wool in the export market is lowered and its price adversely affected by the sale of wool which is not of a high standard of cleanliness. A significant proportion of Irish wool exports goes to the dollar market, but purchasers there are now refusing to take wool unless it can be guaranteed free from tar and other objectionable substances.
