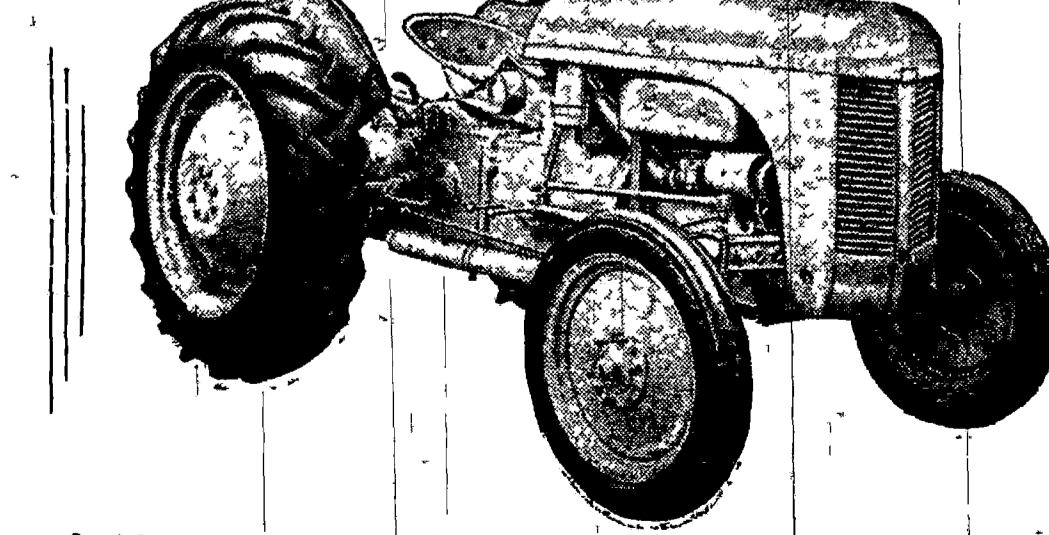

"CARA" The new Irish revivalist movement which has taken such hold in Dublin and in other large centres in the country was effectively launched under way in Dungarvan on Friday night last August 28th. The Chairman, Mr. Pax Whelan, introducing the speaker, Mr. O'Siochain, said he was impressed by the sincerity and enthusiasm of this man. The revival of the Irish Language was one of the essentials in our struggle for National Freedom of 30 or 40 years ago. We had attained something of that freedom, but the language was still a task remaining for solution as far as the masses of the people were concerned. He believed in introducing the Gaelic League was doing good work but it was failing to get any worth while results because its programme was largely that of 60 years ago. It had led to the inauguration of 1916 and subsequent years of military struggle. It was militant in its foundation and possibly may still be so described. It had friends but it was not over popular. The people required something entirely different. A new orientation of our attitude to the Irish language was necessary. The language was not a living tongue in the masses of the people. It had a deep but it was not ardent wish to revive it. This was the programme of Cara. They wanted people to join their clubs regardless of whether they had any Irish at all. Their badge was one of friendship.

It was a shame that in a town like Dungarvan so little Irish was spoken. The formation of a club of Cara was a success in popularising the use of Irish in the area.
