DUNGARVAN DISTRICT COURT

Annual Licensing Sessions

The Annual Licensing Sessions of the Dungarvan District Court were held before Mr. E. O. Rialin, D.J. on Wednesday last.

Renewals of all local publicans' licenses were granted.

On the application of Mr. Williams Solr of the County of CSM Ballroom, Clonea, were granted

Mr O'Connor Solr on behalf of Bobby Keane 7 O'Connell Street, Dungarvan, applied for and was granted an Auctioneer's license

Confirmations of the recent transfers of license to John Grey, Main Street, and Mary McGrath, O'Connell Street were also granted.

Mr Williams Solr on behalf of Anastasia Quealy O'Connell Street applied for an advertisement held before the license held by her late husband, John J. Quealy Mr Williams said that by the terms of his will the deceased had bequeathed the premises to his wife, Mrs. McGrath, the son of applicant gave evidence that his mother was occupying and carrying on business in the premises.

The application was granted. Mr Kathleen Kent O'Connell Street was granted a renewal of her Restaurant license. Renewals of Petroleum licenses were granted to the Secretary R.N.L.I. and Mr Liam Meehan, R.N.L.I.

The usual fair day exemptions were granted and a special early opening exemption as in previous years was granted to Seamus O'Meara, Helbhe Dance Licenses.

The usual dance licenses in respect of the Town Hall Dungarvan, Clubhouse Ballinacorney, CSM Ballroom Clonea and the Fairdoon Hall were all renewed.

Larceny Of Handbag
Michael Power Faha Kilmacthomas and Michael O'Reilly Leamybrien were charged by Supt. J. Flanagan with the larceny of a lady's handbag together with the contents of which the total value was £26 2s 6d, from a car outside the CSM Ballroom, Clonea, on the night of Sept 26th last.

Mr Farrell Solr for both defendants pleaded guilty.

The Superintendent said that on this particular night a lady drove to a dance at Clonea and on her return her car was defective and could not be locked. She left her handbag with its contents in the car and when she came out after the dance the bag was gone.

On the following morning the two defendants were interviewed about the matter and one of them took the Garda to where they had hidden the bag in a small grove near the dance hall. All the contents of the bag were found in cash which they had spent on drink and amusement had been recovered.

The Superintendent described it as a man's type of lighting.

Mr Farrell for both defendants said that the salient point in the case was that there were no previous offences against the defendants, both of whom were of the labouring class. On the day in question both had come to Dungarvan early and had gone into a public house to hear a relay of the All-Ireland final and one of them had won a bet of £5 on the Cork team. They proceeded to drink as much as they could and were under the influence of drink when they arrived in Clonea where they found they had not enough of money to get into the dance. They had to go to the car and found this car with the bag in it open and they took the purse out and spent the money.

Mr Farrell went on to read a certificate of good character for the employer and said that O'Reilly had been too ashamed to ask his employer for one. They were already paying back the money and he handed in a sum of £6 which he had paid to date. The Justice might agree to adjourn the case to give them an opportunity of paying the balance and said that the whole cause of the trouble was drink. He added that he had advised both of them to take the pledge before next Court and said that the Justice might consider this and the fact that they had made full restitution then.

Mr Farrell said that he would not object to Mr Farrell's suggestion as this seemed to be the only way by which the loser would be compensated. He also said that to report the loss and to attend the Court the owner of the bag who came from Templemore had incurred £4 18s 6d expenses.

The Justice said that he did not think this unreasonable and he adjourned the case to the first Court in November to give defendants a chance of paying the balance of £2 17s 6d and the £4 18s 6d expenses.

Co. Waterford Vocational Education Committee

Crux Over Appointment Of Commerce Teacher

Venerable Archdeacon Power, P.P. VF Chairman presided at the monthly meeting of the Co. Waterford Vocational Education Committee held in Dungarvan on Monday evening last. Messrs M. Creagh D. Leaty N. Walsh, T. O'Faolain M. O'Hara Fearmor Deputy Ormond T. McCarthy Senator Butler N. Kelly and J. Mansfield were present. Mr D. Cullinan, C.E.O., was in attendance.

Appointment Of Commerce Teacher

Mr Leaty drew attention to the minutes of the meeting which stated that Thomas Cashin Stradbally had been appointed to the position of permanent whole-time teacher of Commerce in the Co. Waterford Vocational Education Centre. This he said was incorrect as he had made the proposal seconded by Deputy Ormond that Mr Cashin be appointed to the position in a temporary whole-time capacity for a period of 12 months. The C.E.O. said that the Committee had purchased a site for a permanent school three years ago but the building was never commenced and the emergency which required the service of a permanent school as it was a growing town, and he said that he would make inquiries into the possibility of erecting a school on the site of the old Ballinacorney as it would be suitable for large sums of money if the school could be so erected.

The C.E.O. said that he would also add that some of the temporary arrangements for classes could be made in the meantime.

Rural And Social Science Courses

With reference to the courses in the above subjects at Cappoquin and Kilmacthomas towards the end of October a letter was received from University College Cork stating that Gerald E. O'Rahilly, Mr Dr. Cahalan College Cork and Lismore had nominated the following lecturers in sociology for the course—Rev. M. Power B.A., C.C. Kinsalebeg (Cappoquin), and Rev. T. Fitzgerald (Kilmacthomas).

The C.E.O. said that the numbers applying for the course would indicate that there would be about twice the maximum of 25 in each class applying.

Mr J. Baston, teacher-in-charge was appointed headmaster at Cappoquin School subject to sanction.
