"A REASONABLY GOOD REPORT"
I was amused to read in last week's report of the County Council that Mr. Dan Leahy described the report of the committee appointed by the Council to visit Ardkeen Chest Hospital in August as a "reasonably good one."
Perhaps Mr. Leahy is a more reasonable man than I am, but the contents of the report showed that the lot of patients in this newly-built institution is anything but a happy one.
The officials and staff who are for spot-lighting this matter, but the fact is that I have heard many adverse reports about this million pound hospital in the past and refrained from saying anything about it, but now however the cat is out of the bag and I cannot be accused as the one who opened it.
Patients in any hospital and especially in an hospital as Ardkeen where treatment is usually slow must be accorded the fullest personal comforts if they are to progress properly under the medical treatment they get. After all it is the only thing that helps to make hospital life bearable and if it is missing or neglected then the lot of patients is an unenviable one.
I will not add fuel to fire by enlarging on the complaints but I know some of them are of long standing and I also know that in an effort to gain redress among the patients not many months ago.
Surely we have enough officials employed to see that the institution is properly and efficiently worked. I am not looking for a Gresham for the patients but good home comforts that will help them to get well quicker under expert medical guidance.

RECONSTRUCTING EXISTING YOUGHAL BRIDGE IS LUNACY

TOO LONG PLAYTHING OF POLITICS

DISAGREEMENT WITH CORK COUNTY COUNCIL'S DECISION

Waterford County Council resumed discussion on Youghal Bridge at a special meeting held in Dungarvan on Tuesday last. Mr. M. Morrissey, Chairman, presiding. Also present were Messrs W. Fitzgerald, D. and four on each side of the bridge. He proposed to use of the existing piling system to share in the support of the bridge. These existing piles have blades of diameter two feet and six inches, they are founded in stratum of sand and new piles would be seven feet in diameter founded in sand. Spans of 105 feet would not coincide with any line of existing piles.
Mr. McNamara notes on his erection drawing (No. 1) Piled Section—the 105 feet spans will present no spacing or erection difficulties as their extremities will bear on groups of new augments piles. In these circumstances the existing piles would only form a hindrance to construction and could take little part in the support of the new structure. The foundation stress figures amount to 3 1/2 tons per square foot, not two tons per square foot as stated by him at the inquiry.
The rational conclusion to this investigation is that additional traffic will be necessary and that the number of augmenting screw piles has been underestimated. New cylinders could not be driven between the existing cylinders while maintaining the existing bridge. Mr. McNamara's proposals regarding the maintenance of traffic over the existing bridge during reconstruction is difficult to follow. He appeared to have definite ideas on the subject. A sketch of his proposals was requested. This was submitted some time after the inquiry with a covering report. The method suggested differs considerably from the one proposed in the written proposal. It is proposed to demolish the decking on one half the roadway (one span at a time) and replace it by a temporary timber deck. The demolition of the decking will be left for them in the main to restore the timber deck planks on the newly placed cross girders and throw the span open to traffic. A few hours concreting of decking and wind bracing can then proceed without interference to traffic.
This proposal is certainly not practicable. The bow strings would weigh well over one hundred and thirty tons each and are of awkward shape. Craning these heavy girders into place is a hazardous undertaking and the heavy girders must be supported by floor system and wind braces. The cross girders must be grouted in and no load should be put upon them until the grout has hardened. There is no other means connected with the concrete of the deck slab. The sketch supplied to illustrate the proposals shows the bow strings resting directly on the cylinder tops. This is shown to be a cross beam would require the raising of the deck level of the bridge by about thirty inches or cutting into the cylinders. The process is impracticable while maintaining traffic. Therefore it would appear that the cylinder cross head was deliberately omitted. The omission of the crosshead reduces the rigidity of the structure and puts an eccentric load on the cylinders which cannot be disregarded. I have adverted to this earlier in the report.
Mr. McNamara has had plenty of time to produce a scheme for the maintenance of traffic. He has not produced one which is practicable. The fact that additional cylinders are necessary practically rules out the maintenance of traffic over the bridge during reconstruction. A temporary bridge would be extremely costly.
