THE 50 WATERFORD ASSOCIATION OF NEW YORK The County Waterford Association of New York, which carries the crest of a three-masted sailing ship and the legend "Intacta Waterfordia Manet" on its official correspondence will hold its 51st Annual Ball in the Grand Ballroom of the Concourse Plaza Hotel New York on the night of 14th November.

I am indebted to Mr Patrick Kennedy, the Association's general secretary for this information who in a letter sends full details of this great night for all natives of the Deise resident in the City of New York. Chairman of the Association this year is Frank Murphy, a native of Old Parish. Frank was home on holidays last year and called to see us here at the Leader Office before his return to Uncle Sam's land since that time he has been getting his weekly copy of the Leader which brings him all the news from home.

President of the Association is Bob McGrath and it is felt that his selection of Frank Murphy as leader bids fair to be the best thing he has done for many years as Frank enjoys a wide range of popularity in the city of his adoption. Resident of Yonkers since 1927, Frank has associated himself with many Irish Societies, and his readiness to help in any worthy cause, particularly one which has for its object the helping of the Old Land or the old neighbour has endeared him to all. Consequently it is felt that as a personal tribute to Uncle Sam's land, a record attendance at this year's function.

Pat Kennedy's invitation to all the Waterford men and women in New York ends: "Come then to the Concourse on November 14th Meet the good friends and make merry with them once again and make us of the active membership feel that we are doing something that is right and good in arranging this get-together of the neighbours from the Deisce."

"CAUGHT WITHIN RING OF STEEL" This was one of the sensational headings that appeared in the Irish Independent of the morning of April 15th 1923. Sub-headings went on to say "How Mr A Stack was taken," "In Hiding on Mountain Side," and the following report is a deed historical reading of the drama which was being enacted in Ireland thirty years ago.

The well-known leader was captured shortly before noon, says our special correspondent from a little mountain district away up in the Knockmeal-downs. The name of the actual place in which the capture was effected is Dyrick, about two miles south-west of Ballinamult, and about 14 miles south of Clonmel. Mr Stack was found in a field. He was unarmed and offered no resistance when approached by the troops. He was conveyed to Ballinamult which General Frost had made headquarters for the immense mountain drive which has just taken place. General Frost took over the prisoner and brought under the car to Clonmel which is now the military headquarters of the Waterford Command.

There was much excitement in Clonmel on the arrival of the prisoner shortly after 2 o'clock. Many people recognised him as he drove through the town. The capture is a sequel to a big sweep over the hills. Thousands of troops operating from the counties of Tipperary, Waterford, Cork and Limerick surrounded the mountain range of the Comeraghs, Monavullagh, Knockmealdown and the southern slopes of the Galtees, following the sensational capture and death of Liam Lynch. It was known at the time of his arrest that other prominent leaders were in the locality hence the comb out. On Friday night the operation of the side increased expenditure maybe but an urgent and vital necessity.

the mountains from whom reports had been received and whose intention it was to remain there until Saturday morning, and then push on until they got contact with the other columns. One of those columns was that operating from Lismore, and belongs to C Company 4th Battalion Cork. Their part in the drive was the southern portion of the Knockmealdowns and arriving at Dyrick shortly before noon, they discovered a man who was identified as Austin Stack.

The operations are still in progress though the main movement is finished. During the morning operations an aeroplane hovered around the mountain and operated in conjunction with the troops. Another correspondent says that the troops found Mr Stack in a field near a ditch in the mountains between Ballinamult and Mount Mellera and about five miles from the mountain valley where Liam Lynch was captured. He was alone and unarmed and was apparently trying to make his way through the National lines to safety.

Mr Stack was well-dressed but was haggard, ill-looking and weary and had about four days' growth of beard on his face. Three other irregulars whose names are not revealed were captured at Mount Mellera. Another shorter report in the same paper of the same date stated: "Another capture has been made in the mountain sweep a column leader named [redacted] being arrested by a [redacted] column in the Nire Valley at a place called Tooreen. This was the last big operation of the civil war as at that time most of the [redacted] had been in the Knockmeal-down area and shortly afterwards the "cease-fire" order was issued by Mr Frank Aiken then Chief of Staff of the I.R.A., and the hopes of the best of our manhood on both sides ended."

COMMENTARY I was glad to see that the members of the Urban Council discussed at last Friday night's meeting the necessity of re-adjusting the charges for All-Night Dances at Dungarvan. I think that too much latitude has been allowed in this matter and any further discussion on it could do more harm than good.

Senator Butler as usual had an interesting point when he referred to the present scandalous condition of the Council's water supply of the town. It is amazing in view of the small army of officials which the ratepayers have to upkeep, that such a matter of paramount importance to the public health of the community was not being already dealt with officially. It would appear that officials, at any rate, some of them will not take action until a complaint is shown under their noses. I know that housewives have been having a job keeping baths and other utensils clean from the muddy residue in the water during past months while instead of having "clear cool water" to drink we have been having a yellow muddy mixture. Mr McCarthy's reference to the need of replacing the scavenger's horse again opens up a big point. It must be remembered that Dungarvan has grown immensely in latter years and the refuse collection has increased accordingly. You do not have to be a higher mathematician to deduce that what one horse and cart did years ago cannot be done now. I think that there should be one set of men for Dungarvan alone and a separate set to service the ever-growing population of Abbeystown. Increased expenditure maybe but an urgent and vital necessity.

G.A.A. HURLING

MOUNT SION NOW HOLD THREE COUNTY TITLES

FACILE WINS IN SENIOR AND MINOR HURLING DECIDERS

Last Sunday was a great day for the Mount Sion Club, when at Dungarvan Gaelic Field they stamped the hallmark on their claim to being the best intermediate all-round club in the G.A.A. in the country. Having already won the Senior Football title for 1953 they added the Minor and Senior Hurling titles to their bag with effortless wins over Dungarvan and Tourin on Sunday and they are still in the running in the minor football and junior hurling championships, and it is not an impossibility that they will have annexed five titles before the current season closes.

It was a great day for Mount Sion it was a poor day for the opposing teams and more so for the thousands of spectators who travelled by train, car, and bicycle, to the Old Score to see the games. In both it was one-way traffic all the time and the excitement and tenseness usually associated with county finals died an early death when the city hurriers got going.

The failure of the Dungarvan minor hurriers is hard to explain and while it was openly admitted that the city club had their strongest minor combination for years it was thought that this clash would produce a thrilling game but the Dungarvan boys played in a dull listless manner, and Mount Sion proceeded to teach them a lesson in the art of wielding camans. In the senior game the city team played with clock-work precision. They were like a well-oiled finely-gear machine and once they got moving, after about five minutes they were not stopping them. They were truly champion side without a weak link and although Tourin challenged in honest fashion, and to the best of their ability, it was patently evident within a few minutes that they had not the hope of a snowball in a furnace of holding this fast-moving fifteen which played strategic hurling to a set plan. Here was the heraldic play but hurling of a distinct pattern which was grand to watch, and each movement was started with the distinct objective of a scoring dividend and this is proved by the fact that they registered eighteen scores in the hour.

The Mount Sion backs had the edge over the Tourin forwards while Regan, in goal, had an inspired day and netted one goal. In the early part of the game Paddy Fives tried everything to beat O'Regan and his complete unconcern for himself as on countless occasions he faced at top speed in an effort to penetrate the Mount Sion defence thrilled the Tourin supporters but it was impossible to break through. Cashman the smallest man in the Tourin side gave a great account of himself and while he marked the Mount Sion captain, Mick Healy, he definitely had the better of conclusions. Jack Fives at centre back played his best game for a long time and stood out especially in the second half as one of their best defenders while McGrath and Doocoy also had good games. Despite this and the fact that the hurling, especially in the first half, was fast and clean it was the Mount Sion forwards that were registering the scores and these eventually seeped all the starch from the Tourin

team and in the end the city men scored as they liked. Two Pipe bands, the Dungarvan Gaelic League Band and the Abbeysey Boy Scouts Band played the tunes on to the field prior to the Senior game and entertained the spectators during half-time with a number of grand selections while the marching of the Gaelic League band was at its best as far as Dungarvan is concerned. We compliment both, and the selections were greatly appreciated by the spectators.
