"LOWRY LORC" IS COMING

Dungarvan! We are to have a very merry Christmas when the members of St Mary's Choral Society stage their first pantomime ever. We are taking this big step with joy and acclamation. Many of us had to go to great trouble and travel far afield to honour the age-old custom of attending our Christmas Panto. We are all looking forward to our own door and we may thank Fr O'Byrne and Bro Kenny with their troupe of versatile actors and singers for the convenience and the pleasure.

Not only one section of the population will rejoice but a number will be treated to their first Panto and all of us will see the first one ever produced locally.

We are already familiar with the time-old topics of the usual Pantomimes but we are not so familiar with this one. It is original. The script is a most unusual one and from what we can gather it is brimful of witty and humorous situations.

The key-note of the Panto, is a secret and I'm told that it is also the secret of the whole thing. However, it has been given the story from which with a bit of imagination one can well picture the fun in store for us.

I must compliment the Carstairs Brothers who have taken this story from the wealth of our Irish literature and placed it with the top-level subjects of Pantomime for the future. It may be another story of the Kiddies bed-time stories or is it a new one? At all events few of us have ventured beyond the modern Irish Texts and I believe it is obtainable in some form. However, this story of the "Lowry Lorc" was taken straight out of Osborn Bergin's stories from Keating's History of Ireland.

It is a strange fact that the subject of the first ever Panto in Dungarvan should be chosen from a history which was written by one who was so intimately connected with the County Waterford. Sentral Cennan has I have deviated somewhat from the main track so here is the story translated from the middle Irish and given to me by Bro Kenny to whom I am indebted.

It is told of one Lowry Lorc King of Ireland that he had ears like those of a horse a fact that was known to nobody because each time the King had his hair cut the unfortunate barber was immediately beheaded. Each year lots were cast in order to select the King's barber. It so happened that on this particular occasion the lot fell upon a young man who was the only son of his mother and she was a widow.

On hearing this terrible news the widow came and implored the King to save her son. The King took compassion on her and promised to spare her son if he kept secret whatsoever he should see when cutting the King's hair.

At length the fateful day arrived and the young barber came in fear and trembling to the King's palace. He was conducted to a dark tower where he was to cut the King's hair in secret. Strange sounds and wild voices were heard in this room—the ghosts of the former

unfortunate barbers. But when cutting the King's hair he discovered to his horror and amazement that the King had two horses ears. The King warned him never to breathe a word of this to any living person for if the people should discover he had such a blemish he could no longer be a true Irish King.

The young barber promised to keep the secret and so went home to his mother happy to escape with his life. But not long after this time the widow's son fell seriously ill and began to pine away day by day. No doctor could discover what his ailment was till at last a Druidic doctor told him that it was a secret he had with him and that if he should go to the wood and there reveal his secret to a certain tree he would be cured immediately. The boy did as he was told and so was cured.

On hearing this the king knew the secret was out and showed his horse's ears to the court. The people were amazed but were satisfied to be ruled by him if no more barbers were beheaded. This the king promised and so they all lived happily ever after.

All will agree that though a sad tale in parts, it is also a funny affair and lends itself to Panto form. Who would think it should escape the Abbey so long.

What with ghosts and barbers' doctors and wood cutters, and the indomitable Dame we can look forward to plenty of fun and laughter. This is no haphazard affair. Numberless groups have been organised and tutored for the event. The costumers are under the able direction and kind co-operation of Miss M. Clancy and Mrs. Stack. The members of the CYMS under Mr John Cody and Mr Páidie Kenneally, are wanting to it that in no way will the staging and effects be found wanting.

The Dungarvan Orchestra which has so often in recent years charmed the public with its versatile playing is again to take an integral part of the Show. Its numbers will be varied to suit the tastes of all. Also troupes of dancers are to enhance the Show with artistic dancing of the un-diminished kind to our stage in Dungarvan.

Concerning the personnel of the Panto it is not necessary to introduce any of its members as they have already proved their worth. Certainly with "Andrew Sisters" and "Danny Kaye" or any of the soloists we heard last Easter we may have heard as to the high standards to expect.

Tommy Duggan is to play the role of King Lowry Lorc and Miss Ruth Gittens will be his capable barber. Mr James Corbett and Mr James Corbett need no introduction from me as they will play leading parts also. A tenor of singular sweetness who has only been tutored and encouraged in re-barbering is Mr D O'Mahony. I understand he is to play the role of the Bard. It is safe to say that his voice will outshine his harp in tune and beauty.

These are the outstanding members of the cast, and while giving them prominence it is fair to say that each member of the Show will be as good as when the acting and jollity of the Show will be recalled to us on the 27th of December.

At present it is the talk of the town. Critics and non-critics have taken the fever. One member of the CYMS expressed his feeling when he told me that he feared neither construction critics or destructive critics. Dungarvan Club's Tournament Draws Record Attendance.

House full notices were posted at all entrances to the Town Hall Dungarvan on Friday night last for the local Clubs' Tournament and every available seat and bit of standing room was crowded to capacity. It was a great tribute to the Dungarvan Club that such a record attendance turned up and although a certain amount of disappointment was caused when an announcement was made that a number of the main bouts had to be cancelled due to the contestants not turning up the crowd realising that it was due to no fault of the promoting club accepted the announcement in a very sporting manner. The bouts which made up the programme were well received and the contestants showed great promise while what others lacked in ability they made up for with superabundance of enthusiasm and gave the crowd full value for their money.

Main interest in the night was the appearance of Noel Sheehan the new Junior Featherweight Irish Champion in young Butler of Cork he had an opponent worthy of his mettle and a grand contest was served up. Sheehan showed himself a real champion and that he has improved and the experience he has gained in the National Championships has put a good polish to his ability.

Only knock-out of the night was in a welter contest when Bill Barry of the local Club showing a style reminiscent of his father who was a great boxer knocked out his Army opponent Pte. Conning in the second round. For this performance he was awarded a special prize presented by Mr Liam Morrissey, M.C.C. Dungarvan.

All the Dungarvan boxers gave great accounts of themselves and the local club must rank as one of the best in the Provinces at the moment and boxers and Committee of the Club are to be highly congratulated.

During the course of the Tournament a presentation of a beautiful wrist watch was made on behalf of the Club to Noel Sheehan for the great honour he had achieved and also a cigarette case to Mr Hanley Carrick B.C. who acted as his second in the National Contests.

Horticultural Instructors' Reply To Letter From Springmount Nurseries

Reference To Sixteen Ribbed Pigs

Mr P R Power, Chairman, presided at the monthly meeting of the County Waterford Committee of Agriculture held in Dungarvan on Saturday last. Messrs D Leahy, M. Harty, N Walsh, M McGrath, J Quirke, J Fahy, D Heskin, P Barron, J Meade, T Power and W Dower were also present. Messrs P O'Keefe, C O and P O'Shea, and P O'Sullivan Horticultural Instructors were in attendance.

Finance

The C.A.O. informed the Committee that the net balance in favour of the Committee was £1,034 16s 1d.

Grain Storage

A letter from the Department in reply to a recent resolution of the Committee (proposed by Mr Harty) stated that arrangements were at present in progress to make better facilities for storing and drying grain available.

Appointment Approved

The Department approved of the appointment of Mr P Sheridan, as temporary Instructor in Agriculture.

Cow Testing Associations

A report from the Department stated that there were twelve branches in the county embracing 225 members with 2,826 cows on test.

Premium Bulls

Correspondence from the Department also stated that all premium bulls standing in the County had been inspected and 15 had been passed for continuation premiums.

Two of last year's bulls had not been shown for inspection. When the C.A.O. stated that the 26 premium bulls in the County had all been accepted for continuation premiums Mr Harty stated that the pig industry from the export point of view was facing a serious situation. He had heard of the record he said that the Department were having a tally kept at certain bacon factories on the carcasses of pigs killed. He had also heard that some pigs had been got with 16 ribs instead of the usual 14 and as there was a big rumpus over the question of lean bacon it was for a great asset to a long-bodied pig could be produced.

If the local factories were asked for their co-operation in also keeping such tallies and reporting where any 16-ribbed pigs came from they might be able to find out how such pigs are bred. This was a matter of great importance to the pig industry as the long-bodied pig was wanted all over the world.

Marketing Of Onions At Springmount Nurseries

Mr Harty proposed a resolution (which was passed) asking the Department to facilitate the producers of onions in the Ardmore area by providing a market for their crops as imported onions highly seriously affected the sale of the home produced crop.

Contract or Shelter Belt Trees

With reference to the letter from Springmount Nurseries Dungarvan concerning the placing of the above read at the last meeting the Chairman stated that the letter had got a great deal of publicity. He said that all the tenders received had been seriously treated by the Instructors and the letter had been a serious reflection on the Horticultural Instructors as if they had so placed the contract as to let the trees be planted at a loss of £50 to the Committee it would be a serious matter. In view of this he said that since the last meeting he had discussed the matter with both of them and to see what influenced them in recommending the tender accepted and as a result he felt that the Committee had done the right thing in accepting the tender received.

Mr Walsh—As I said at the last meeting where the Committee first made the mistake was that the officials were not first asked to report back their findings before the contract was placed.

Mr Conroy said that this would have caused a delay and would have been too long. Referring to the letter from Springmount Nurseries he said that it had come as a complete
