Since the farmer has to take full advan- SHOULD ANY FITTING OR SWITCH tage of daylight for field work, a good BECOME BROKEN OR DAMAGED. deal of yard and out-office work has to be done after dark

Well placed lights both inside and outside make this easier and quicker Positions for yard lights should be chosen to give the best use without risk of damage from farm traffic They should be about 15 feet above ground level and at points where lamp replacement would not be difficult

For out-offices, hanging lights fitted with ceiling rose mounted on wooden ridge-beam or rafter are most suitable Leaky roofs should be repaired and fittings should be high enough to avoid damage. Switches fixed 5 to 6 feet above floor level will not be so liable to damage and should be at convenient REPLACE IT IMMEDIATELY

Location and number of lights in the yard or offices is principally decided by convenience for working The table below is a guide to good practice, assuming 100 watt bulbs. Supplementary lights will be found very useful at regular working points.




