## BEHIND THE SPOTLIGHT with PENSMAN

**FATHER PEYTON'S ROSARY RALLY**

Dungarvan and its people gave a real hearty Irish Catholic welcome to Rev. Father Patrick Peyton who is travelling around the world on a Family Rosary Crusade for the first of three diocesan rallies held on last Sunday night 11th July.

Streets were profusely decorated with bunting, banners and streamers while practically every house in both parishes of Dungarvan and Abbeyside displayed its own little tribute to the Queen of the Holy Rosary in the form of beautiful and ornate altars, statues and pictures. The main colour schemes were blue and white and gold and white and all efforts achieved a wonderful effect. It was indeed a most fitting back-cloth for the inspiring and impressive scenes that followed. From an early hour in the evening people began to arrive in town by cars, buses, bicycles, traps and carts and then later the over-flowing trains that came from East and West, saw thousands emerging from the local railway station to join the ever-swelling throng.

At the Rally venue at the Shandon Show Grounds the special committee in charge of the arrangements did a thing fully under control and the great efficiency they had achieved was marked by an absolute absence of confusion. It was a sterling effort which reflected the highest credit on the organisational ability of those concerned. Constant announcements over the public address system directed the incoming throng to vacant seats, gave points around the four-acre field and as a result the pandemonium and excitement which one might reasonably expect in the marshalling of such a huge crowd was conspicuous by its absence.

I had been in the field earlier in the day when Ven. Archdeacon Power, P.P. and his willing band of workers were putting the finishing touches to the magnificent stand and Altar and the stewards were receiving their last minute instructions in the marshalling of the crowd to come. Arranging the huge containers of multi-coloured flowers around the Altar was Mr. Paul J. Power who put his considerable artistic and organising talents to work completely at the disposal of the Committee. There I also saw Mr. Jack Lynch, Mr. Pat Walsh, our Borough Surveyor, Mr. Denis Cullinan, Mr. Jack Tobin, Mr. Faddy Brown, and Mr. Donald Lynch who work with all the other members of the committee to achieve the results which met with the unstinted approval of everyone who came to the Rally.

The Rally itself is fully reported elsewhere in this issue but the general opinion of the thousands who came was that they would have been most sorry to have missed such a memorable occasion.

Father Peyton himself is a big simple sincere man whose personal conviction in the message his mission carries is far more impressive on the minds of his listeners than the greatest eloquence could ever be.

It was indeed a privileged occasion and one that will be remembered with happy memories by all.

## MODERN APOSTLE OF FAMILY PRAYER DRAWS THOUSANDS TO DUNGARVAN

### Impressive Scenes At Rosary Crusade Rally

Those privileged to attend will forever remember the impressive scenes which marked the first Rally of Rev. Fr. Peyton C.S.M., in Munster, in the course of his Family Rosary Crusade held in Dungarvan on last Sunday night. It was certainly in keeping with the tradition of the title of Parva Roma bestowed by the Pope in 1640 by the Papal Nuncio Cardinal Rinuccini and when the congregation of close on 15,000 had gathered at the Show Grounds drawn from all quarters of Mid and West Waterford and East Cork it proved in no uncertain manner the love and devotion which the people have for the Rosary of the Mother of God.

Notable amongst the congregation were Most Rev. Dr. P. O'Donnell, Co-adjutor Archbishop of Brisbane and the 70 Australian Pilgrims of Irish extraction presently visiting Marian Year Shrines in Ireland. Sharp on time the procession from St. Mary's Parish Church which included acolytes, local schoolchildren, members of the various religious orders, public representatives and officials and the Children of Mary bearing a flower bedecked statue of the Blessed Virgin started through the town for the Show Grounds. Then came the priests and his Lordship Most Rev. Dr. Conlan, Bishop of Waterford & Lismore with whom were Ven. Archdeacon Power, P.P. V.F., Dungarvan and Rev. Fr. Peyton, escorted by a Guard of Honour of F.C.A. The music for the hymns was played by the Dungarvan Brass and Red Band Excelsior Band.

Rally venue was absolutely no confusion in the marshalling of the huge gathering and a fine public address system assured that the words of all the speakers reached every one in the great throng and even far outside its confines.

At the Show Grounds a magnificent stand and Altar had been erected on the south side of the field. From this fascia bearing the words in white letters on a blue background.

The family that prays together stays together. The stand were the processions and outside that the general public.

**Pope's Appeal**

Opening the Rally Archdeacon Power said that he had all come together to honour the Mother of God who was also our Mother and Queen of Ireland and next to her the P.P. McGrath P.P. Cappoquin read the appeal of His Holiness Pope Pius XII for the restoration of the family Rosary in this Holy Holiness wrote that never before had the world been so direly in need of prayer as a dangerous form of materialism tended to undermine man and to destroy the sanctity of family life.

The most powerful antidote against these evils was prayer especially collective prayer. He wrote His Holiness and there cloud form of prayer than the family Rosary. There was no surer means of calling down God's blessing and of preserving peace and happiness in the home than the daily recitation of the Rosary.

The appeal ended by imparting to those attending the Rally, the Papal Blessing.

**Rosary Recited**

Archdeacon Power then announced that the Rosary would be recited for Father Peyton's intentions and he commenced with the first decade the subsequent decades being recited by Very Rev. Fr. T. Dunphy P.P. Ballyduff, D. Power, P.P. Kilgobnet, P. Cahill, P.P. Ardmore and Rev. Fr. Dee Perth Australia. The mass responses by the thousands present was indeed, most impressive.

**Pearl Beyond All Price**

Archdeacon Power then welcomed all who had come to the Rally and congratulated them on the wonderful response which they had given to the appeal of His Lordship the Bishop who inaugurated the Rally, and to whom they were indebted for the great honour.

They had come together he said to honour the Mother of God and the Rosary which they owed to their forefathers who had been strengthened and encouraged by it to hand down to the true Catholic Faith.

Archdeacon Power recalled the trials and persecution of our forefathers in the Penal times when there had been a price on the priests' heads and when the people had neither sacraments nor sacrifice. The Churches had been destroyed and the Altars plundered but the one thing, he said, the enemy could not wrest from our forefathers was the Rosary.

## Dungarvan Urban Council Accords Civic Reception To Rev. Father Peyton

On Friday evening last 9th July the members of the Dungarvan Urban Council accorded a civic reception to Rev. Father Peyton to mark his visit to Dungarvan to conduct the Rosary Crusade Rally.

Father Peyton accompanied by Ven. Archdeacon Power, P.P. V.F., and Rev. Robert Keane Bishop's Secretary, arrived at the Town Hall over which the Town flag was flying at 6.30 pm. The assembly met at the entrance by the Chairman of the Council Mr. Thomas Lannen the Co-Manager Mr. S. J. Moynihan, and the Town Clerk Mr. E. Deery who escorted him to the Council Chamber and introduced him to the members of the Council and Press Representatives present.
