Satisfactory Season Reported

Annesley Inspector Woulfe reported that the season just closed was a satisfactory one when 23,500 salmon, 6,948 grilse and 1,185 sea-trout were taken by nets, rods and weirs, the total weight being practically 121 tons.

Two applications were received for the position of assistant inspector to the Board. John Fanning, Fermoy and John Lineen, Lismore. On a poll the former was appointed by sixteen votes to two for a probationary period of six months.
