



The shrine of St Maelruain's Missal better known as the "Stowe Missal was made in 1023 by Dunchod O Tagan of Clonmacnoise for the King of Cashel and Donnchad O Brien, King of Ireland, to contain one of the old Irish manuscripts dating from 6th or 7th century. The cover was made at a later date about the end of the 14th century. The shrine which was kept at Tallaght Co Dublin, was lost to Ireland for some time but fortunately was found again in Bavaria and is now one of the treasures of the National Museum Dublin
