



The Cross of Cong, reputed to be the most beautiful processional cross in existence, was made for Turlough O Connor, King of Connacht and Ireland in 1123 by Maeljesu Mac Bratdan O Echan at Roscommon The outer casing covering a yew container is made of bronze plates covered with panels of gold filigree and plates of silver-gilt interlaced Celtic ornament set with precious stones and enamels. It is now one of the treasures of Ireland and can be seen in the National Museum, Dublin.
