

The Domnach Airgid, also known as The Shrine of St Patrick's Gospel is a wonderful piece of early Irish craftsmanship It comes from Clones Co Monaghan where it was believed to contain the Gospels associated with St Patrick The yew-wood box with its bronze plates bearing a beautiful and intricate pattern of interlaced Celtic design the oldest and most important part of the shrine, was probably made in the 9th century. The highly-ornamented cover of silver plate was not part of the original structure — it was added about the middle of the 15th century This beautiful Irish treasure can be seen in the National Museum.
