FARMING SUCCESSES No. 4

LIGHT, HEAT AND POWER PROVE INVALUABLE ON GALWAY FARM


S EAN O'MALLEY farms about 60 acres in Co. Galway and he always lamented the fact that in winter the working day closed so early cutting off valuable time which he could have used for grinding grain, or handling other odd jobs in his outhouses.

Rural Electrification however, brought the answer to his problem and when he was connected he had both the yard and the outhouses wired for light Now he can work at any time he likes in the comfort, safety and convenience of good lighting

Sean regards pigs as a good investment but in the pre-electrification days, he knew the trouble and hardship involved in fattening and in saving the litters. As he says himself "If you lost a few bonhams you lost any bit of profit with them" When he got electricity he built two warmed slabs in the stys and now not only do his pigs fatten quicker but bonham mortality is down to nothing - he has reared the full litter every time since electric floor warming was installed

He also bought a grain grinder which costs £49, but he took it on HP terms, and he reckons that he's buying it for nothing - his savings more than pay for the instalments. Mrs O'Malley brought her kitchen up-to-date with an electric cooker and a washing machine and iron. Now she can't remember how she ever did without them

The O'Malley's admit quite frankly that electricity has made their farming life easier, more pleasant and more profitable. No matter what kind of farming you carry on, it can do the same for you.
