



Captain William Peel accompanied a friend to a point-to-point meeting one day in 1846, but when they arrived at the meeting the Captain was disappointed in a promised mount. His friend jokingly offered him the horse which had drawn their gig to the meeting and the Captain accepted the offer in the same spirit. The horse carried Captain Peel so well in the race that he bought it from his friend and used him for hunting and later for steeplechasing in 1848 he was entered for the Grand National and ridden by the famous Josey Little he won in a close finish The horse s name was Chandler, so called because he had once drawn a chandler s cart through the streets of Birmingham
