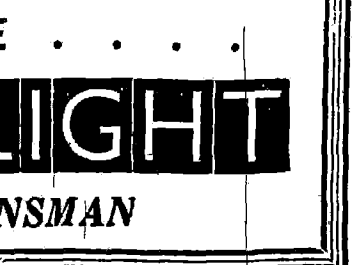

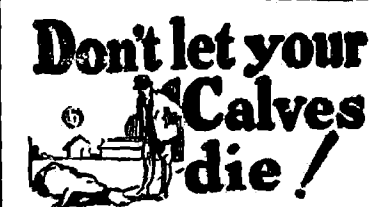

"Sidelights on Irish Dairying Close Relation Between Milk And Tillage (By 'SLIEVENAMON') It is needless to stress the vital importance of milk to physique and health. The milk of human kindness is praise in deed. The promised land was once flowing with milk and honey and in the words of a well-known Gaelic poet the milk of the cow had been flung back to a land where the butter and the cream do worry about an ideal dairy country with as a poet put it 'climate soft as a mother's smiling face' and soil fertile as God's love the chief Irish butter markets at one time set the European standard for price and quality. While other countries less favourably circumstanced have failed to attain our milk yield has made a retrograde movement."

Milk Strain Of Our Herds A Scot with wide experience of dairying who had been closely associated with Sir Horace Plunkett told me some years ago that while contour and condition had improved the milk strain of our herds had improved in judicious breeding. The milk had been sacrificed to meat through Herefords AAs and even better Shortborns brought over at huge prices from Perth by our plucky Irish bidders. To the intelligent and progressive dairy farmer the milk selection of their cross breeds are an abomination. In its due place the cattle trade is important but why sacrifice to it our whole farm economy? More tillage can mean as in other countries far more production generally as well as a big increase in livestock employment and trade also native balanced feeding for our stock which with judicious selection and retention of the best progeny will level up our milk yields to something like the Danish Dutch or even Belgian level.

Consider these anomalies— 1 On the average, Danish and Dutch cows yield about 90 and 100 p.c more than ours with only 500 million gallons in 1955 for 14 million cows (or say) 400 gallons each. Many give less than 250. 2 With profit the Danes can make butter at 3/- per lb while because of inefficiency in our cows and perhaps elsewhere it cannot be done here for 4/- on far better dairyland. Will Minis ters and others urge import of butter as wheat? 3 To the detriment of dairying and tillage milk to the value of 7 1/2 millions fed to farm animals is credited to livestock as well as cultivated crops worth over 50 million sterling. To tillage and turf for about 24 million arable acres must be credited about 55 p.c of our gross farm output from 17 million acres.

The Cow And The Plough On the cow with average yield of 700 gallons at least and satisfactory stores and the plough cultivating 30 p.c of arable we should strive to build our farm and hence our main economy. This leaves 134 million acres untilled. 5 Even at its present cit, price milk is relatively cheap butter far cheaper. In calorific content a gallon of milk equals 2 1/2 lbs of beef or over 7 1/2 lbs of chicken and over 5 lbs of eggs. Milk is 3 200 calories skim about 1 700 per gallon whole. 6 Irish people on the average take far too little milk less than three-quarters of the daily allowance in our cities often do with a pint for five or six and the result is apparent in pinched faces and spindly shanks. Children never get over a lack of milk in formative years. Experienced teachers can confirm this. Top little value is placed on skim milk deficient only in fat. Many city children that are overfed are undernourished lacking a balanced diet.

What Thrift And Health Suggest 7 At average prices of 42 pence per gallon for milk in Dublin it will be found that butter is about half the price. It takes to make 10 lbs of butter costing now 37/6 almost 24 gallons of milk which at 3/6 per gallon means 84/- As the skim from 24 gallons is estimated at round 7/6 butter and skim come to 45/- Relatively the cost of processing etc is small. Thrift and health alike would urge a high consumption of butter per capita. The average inclusive price at the creameries is scarcely 2/- per gallon. 8 A gallon of whole milk at 3/- per cent of butter fat suffices to make one lb of Cheddar cheese now at nearly 3/- per lb. Processing takes more in time and labour. It seems deplorable that to a semi people country such as this we must import cereals, meat and milk products to the extent of tens of millions annually and we are blind to the basic causes. 9 Where The Milk Goes 9 Of the 500 million gallons total yield estimated for 1955 15 per cent goes to farm animals 21 per cent for human consumption 7 per cent for chocolate crumb milk powder and cheese and the remaining 87 per cent for butter of which two-thirds is creamery. 10 We are credited with consuming annually on the average 40 lbs of butter so that the 1 070 000 cows made in 1955 would just suffice. In consumption of butter this State is placed next to New Zealand. It would be of interest to know how much crosses the Border in addition to the captured tons the Border does not bar co-operation in consumption. 11 In the five years ended 1955 the average butter production was 1,242,000 cwt, while in the last five years it was 1,053,000 cwt. In 1944 5 1/2 averaged 1,064 000 cwt. when we had 50 per cent more tillage, 55 per cent more horses, and almost as many horned cattle.
