NEW DRUG AT MENTAL HOSPITAL
Discussion Ruled Out
 'That is a matter for the medical profession and not for this Board,' Ald Wm Kennelly, Chairman, Waterford Mental Hospital Management Board ruled at a meeting of that body on Tuesday when Councillor Robert Keane, Dungarvan asked about a new American drug which, he said, was used in the hospital.
 Mr Keane said he understood that one patient to whom the drug was administered remained in a coma for eight days. He wanted to know if this were so.
 Observing that this was not a matter for the Board Chairman Kennelly told him 'I'm sorry but I cannot allow you to discuss

REQUEST TO FORMULATE NEW HOUSING SCHEME
"People In Bad Way For Houses"—Councillor Keane
 Mr T. A. Kynne T.D. Chairman presided at the usual meeting of the above held on last Friday night July 27th.
Proposed Demolition
 Aising from the minutes Mr N. Kelly again referred to the house owned by Mrs. Croxty of Sexton Street, Abbeyside, and criticised the decision to have it demolished. The Council could find themselves in serious trouble if this was done he said.
 The Chairman said that he saw no point in bringing the matter up again at this stage as the recommendation made at the previous meeting had not so far been acted on.
 The discussion ended.

Motor Cars At New Road
 The Chairman said that he had received complaints that people were parking cars along the New Road at Abbeyside causing a danger to children. Cars he said should not be permitted to go down there.
 It was agreed to instruct the Engineer to have obstacle stakes erected at the mouth of the road to prevent cars from entering.

Objection To Hoarding
 A letter from Mr Luke Dalton, Draper, Grattan Square, called on the Council to take steps to have the hoarding erected around the building adjoining his premises 14 months ago removed. It was not done, the letter stated that he would have to take legal steps to protect his interests.
 Mr Keane said that the people who erected the hoarding should either go ahead with whatever plans they had for the building or else take it down. It was not fair to have the window of Mr Dalton's shop shut off as it was he said and neither was it fair for the people to have to go on the road to pass the hoarding.
 The Clerk stated that Mr Dalton had written some months ago stating that plans for the premises were being prepared. Mr Keane said that the plan was being used as a lavatory at night and it was far too long to let it as it was for such a long time.
 Mr Casey said that the reconstruction of the premises probably set big problems and he would not be for pressing them too much. He suggested that Mr Dalton's complaint might be met by angling the hoarding in so as to allow the window to be seen.
 It was decided to refer this suggestion to the Engineer to see if it would suit.

Housing Scheme
 Mr Keane asked if there was any further news concerning the proposed housing scheme for the town.
 The Chairman said that the Minister had confirmed the order under which the Council proposed to acquire the site at Bohernatra (see Replies to Dail Questions page four).
 Mr Keane—We should go ahead with a scheme without delay as the people are in a bad way for houses.
 Mr Casey said that it was his opinion that it was a shame to build houses at Bohernatra.
 Mr Keane—I agree with that but couldn't another site be got.
 The Chairman said that despite much opposition he had won his point and houses would be built at Bohernatra. He proposed that the County Manager be requested to formulate a scheme for Bohernatra and this was seconded by Mr Keane.
 On a suggestion by the Town Clerk it was agreed before taking a final decision to put the matter on the agenda for next meeting.

 Mr J. McCarthy asked that the Strand at Quanny's be cleaned and lowered. From Harcourt Street there will be a special train to Arklow at 3 p.m. and another to Wexford at 3.45 p.m.

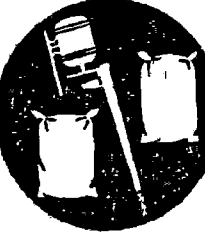
