





The problem of finding longitude resolves itself into one of relationship between the time at the first meridian and the time at the unknown point At sea, the difficulty of getting a clock to maintain accurate time seemed insurmountable Gemma Frisius tried lantern clocks in gimbals without success In 1714 a prize of £20,000 was offered for a method that would be accurate to within half a degree in a six weeks' voyage This prize was ultimately paid to John Harrison, the son of a Yorkshire carpenter who devoted his life to the production of a satisfactory mechanical time-piece.
