





Verge and Foliot

The origin of mechanical time-keepers is still somewhat obscure One of the earliest systems for governing clockwork was by means of the verge and foliot. In this a heavy bar or foliot pivoted at its centre, was caused to oscillate by a toothed wheel acting upon two pallets fixed to a vertical rod called a verge By adjusting the position of two weights upon the bar the speed of the movement could be quickened or retarded In spite of its imperfections this form of escapement remained in universal use for over three hundred years until the advent of the pendulum about 1660
