## Time and Shape

Sundials, perhaps more than any other scientific instruments, give scope to the designer, in as much as they are capable of being made in an almost infinite variety of forms There are, however, two main groups - those which indicate time by the sun's altitude and those which embody a compass and tell the time by the sun's direction. The construction of sundials must have been one of the earliest applications of a knowledge of the sun's apparent motion From about 1500 onwards great interest was taken in Europe in the theory of their construction. Many fixed dials were set up in public places and much ingenuity was devoted to the design of portable dials, some types of which are shown above.
