VOCATIONAL COMMITTEE AFFAIRS

Ven. Archdeacon D Power P.P. V Chairman presided at the monthly meeting of the Vocational Committee held in Dungarvan on last Tuesday evening.

Approval—The Department approved the appointment of Miss Muriel Stokes, Chair as Domestic Economy Instructor. The C.E.O., Mr D. Cullinan, recalled that at the last meeting the Committee had appointed Miss O'Neill, Co. Clare, to the post with Miss Stokes as second choice.

Economies—The C.E.O. reported that in accordance with the economy policy of the Department, it would be possible to reduce the estimated requirements in teaching staff up to 1955 by one as compared with the list prepared last February.

Farm Machinery Course—The Committee unanimously agreed to a suggestion by the C.E.O. to hold a course in the maintenance of farm machinery at Dungarvan during the month of November.

Coal Tenders—The following tenders for the supply of 35 tons of steam coal at Dungarvan were received—Co-Op Creamery at £9 17s 6d per ton, J. & S. McGee at £9 17s 6d per ton, K. Williams & Co. at £9 a ton.

Overlapping—Arising from an application by Mr T. Maher, Rural Science Teacher for a special allowance for extra activities Mr N. Walsh said that it seemed to him that there was a considerable amount of overlapping with the activities carried out by Instructors of the Committee of Agriculture.

Junior Footballers Defeated—Cappoquin junior footballers fared for County honours this season as they were narrowly but beaten by Stradbally in the final of the West Waterford Championship at Dungarvan on Sunday last.

HEALTH MINISTER CONFERS WITH CO. COUNCIL
