Dungarvan has lost one of its most colourful, lovable and popular personalities by the tragical sudden demise last week of Michael J. Keane. To say that he will be missed from amongst us is an understatement as his gay manner and always smiling and cheerful countenance were unique and peculiar to him alone. M. J. Keane was known to all and to none high and low layman and churchman with a cheery salute and hearty handshake. His popularity knew no bounds in Dungarvan and throughout the county for his generous big-hearted ways.

Outside of his bereaved widow family and relatives those next to miss him most will be the poor of the town for whom he wanted to see welfare he worked for many years as a leading member of the local St Vincent de Paul Society. Next came his interest in the welfare of Dungarvan and its inhabitants generally. He was ever willing to give help and support to any movement for the advancement of the town. During the many years in which he held office of the Catholic Urban District Council he made many constructive suggestions and was ever mindful of the ratepayers' interests. I don't have to mention what a great Catholic he was. He was a great Catholic and he knew that he was never very far from the church. He was a loving husband and a kind father who reared a most excellent family. On the social side one of his main hobbies was amateur theatricals and for many years he was a leading member of the Dungarvan Dramatic Club. As I stood in the throng in Friary Street waiting for the funeral of his remains on last Thursday night I found it difficult to imagine that "M. J." had breathed his last in this mortal world and that no more would we hear his cheery salutes to those we knew or true when I heard the invocation—"grant his soul eternal rest O Lord" to which with the huge concourse I joined in saying a fervent Amen.

HIGH INCIDENCE OF BURNING FATALITIES

RIGHTS OF MEMBERS TO COMPETE IN CATTLE PRIZE SCHEME

At the monthly meeting of the County Committee of Agriculture held in Dungarvan on Saturday last the CAO Mr. J. J. Curran in compliance with a request made at last meeting concerning the qualifications necessary for a person to be a member of the Committee stated that according to the Statute Act 1931 the only qualification was that a person have a practical knowledge of or an interest in agricultural land. The members agreed that this qualification covered practically everyone in the county.
