NOVEL TURKEY MARKET

Most residents in Dungarvan and area will be thinking already of the near approach of Christmas and all the additional chores and expenses that it involves. One of the first problems, and I suppose the central one to be decided is the Christmas dinner and when I mention Christmas dinner I mean turkey for it.

In recent years the prices for turkeys put them in the luxury class and out of the reach of many people who had to budget for the Christmas dinner. However, this year the prices are most reasonable and a turkey should be well within the scope of most households and I feel I am not being extravagant when I make that statement. However, there is another side to the story and while the prices ruling this year favour the consumer they are far from pleasing, as far as the producer is concerned. All I think that there is a certain amount of chaos in the turkey market this year.

Be that as it may what I want to focus the spotlight on is the proposal by Country Markets Ltd. to hold a Christmas Turkey Show and Market in Dungarvan on Thursday the 13th December. There is an advertisement elsewhere in this issue making an official announcement to this effect and when I first saw it I was just as I suppose you are, intrigued, so I went along to see Mr. Paddy Conroy the Chief Agricultural Officer in the county for further information on the table when the Council assembled a little after 2 p.m. contained 11 items when six of them chimed (time agreed on to end activities) item 7 had which has been reached and of these two of the most important had been adjourned to later meetings.

Waterford County Council Discusses Dismissal Notices To Clerks Deputation To See Minister

The issue of dismissal notices to five members of the clerical staff employed in a temporary capacity for the past few years was discussed at a rather stormy session at the adjourned quarterly meeting of Waterford County Council held in Dungarvan on Monday last.

The discussion was opened by the Chairman Mr Michael Morrissey who stated that he had received two letters as Chairman of the Council from Messrs J F Williams & Son Solicitors Dungarvan giving notice on behalf of two of the employees concerned, of their intention to take legal proceedings against the Council. The first was on behalf of William F O'Dea St Augustine's Terrace, Abbeyside Dungarvan and the other on behalf of Miss Josephine Liddane Park Terrace Dungarvan.

Resolution Not Sent
Mr J Ormond T.D. asked whether legal advice had been taken before the issue of the notices, and the County Manager Mr S J Moylan stated that it had and he was sure that everything was in order. The Chairman recalled that over a fortnight ago the Council had passed the last of a number of resolutions dealing with this matter calling on the Department to sanction the permanent appointment of all those employed in a temporary capacity. This resolution had never been forwarded to the Department he said and this was entirely wrong and it was useless for the Council to be passing resolutions if this was what was going to happen to them.

The Manager said that the Secretary had a report on the matter which covered this point and which incorporated a letter from the Department on the subject.

The Chairman who stated that he had already seen this report said that the original letter produced and the Department's reply from it as given in the report.

This thing has gone a bit far said the Chairman and when we pass a resolution and it's not done I don't know who the Secretary is working for. It's not right at all or what business have we here if that's what's going to be done.

Know What Was In Letter
Mr T Lannen said that an explanation should be got from the official involved. It was well-known by certain members of the Council the last day what was in the letter he said.

Mr M Hartly asked as the matter was sub-judice whether it was wise to discuss it now. Mr Lannen—The whole position will have to be cleared up. Mr Curran—There's no doubt but there was some muddling somewhere and the Council should get all the facts as it is their duty to find out where this muddling took place. Outside of the legal aspects a gross injustice has been done to those concerned.

Secretary's Report
The Chairman then read the report of the Secretary on the resolution passed by the Council on the 3rd September calling for the permanent appointment of the temporary clerks involved. The report referred to a letter from the Department dated 28th October 1956 which laid down that the recommendation of the Council could not be approved. The Department however the report went on to say have approved of the permanent appointment of two clerical officers from the 1953

that the clerks concerned had only been taken on for temporary duty and that had been made clear to them. They had no rights whatever to claim permanent appointments.

Mr Lannen then moved that a public sworn inquiry be held into the whole affair and this was seconded by Mr Curran.

Mr Ormond said that a sworn inquiry would be very costly and he thought that it would be better for a deputation to await on the Department first.

The Council then agreed to this unanimously and Mr Lannen withdrew his motion in favour of it, but said Mr Lannen if a satisfactory solution is not forthcoming as a result of this deputation I will again move for a Sworn Inquiry.

Messrs H Dowd N Walsh T Lannen and the Chairman Mr M Morrissey were selected to go on the deputation to the Department.

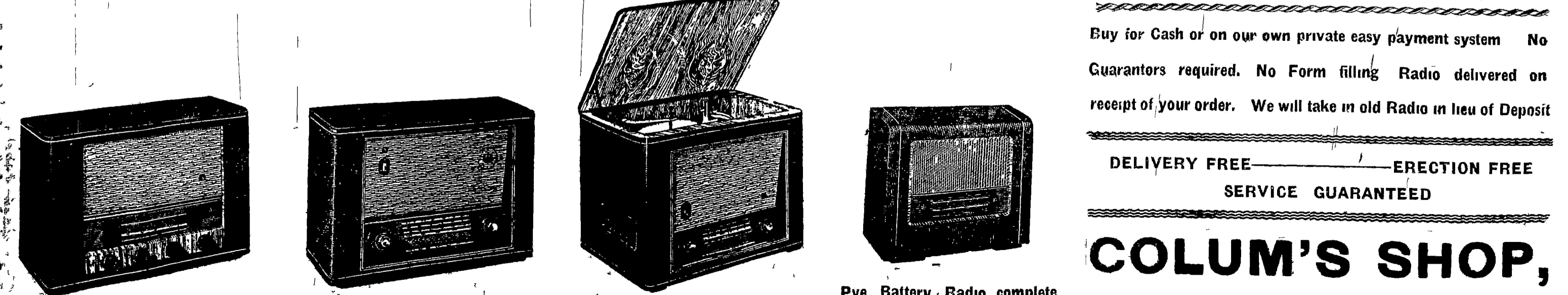
