

For better, for worse, many a woman is married to mince Sirloin she'd like, chops she'd love but the cash won't often run to them Mince has to be her standby Often her last stand against the wolf at the door. At its worst mince can be a tasteless mess. At its best, a delicious dish. Cook it this way and call it a Pie Put the mince in a greased dish with the usual seasonings of pepper, salt, minced onion and a dash of mixed herbs if you like Now make a potato crust. It won't take long. Mash about I lb potatoes, add salt and 2 ozs melted fat Work in as much flour as the potatoes will take, just like a potato cake Roll out and cover the meat with it Cook till crisp and brown Here's another way Put the fresh mince in a bowl, season and add chopped onion. Mix a beaten egg through it. Shape into balls, roll well in flour and fry in hot fat. The flour coating keeps out the fat, retains the juiciness and full flavour of the meat If the floured meat balls were dipped in coating batter before frying, they would be even better still
