

BEET GROWERS

Representatives of the Beet Growers' Association and of the Irish Sugar Com pany met to day 25th January, and issued the following joint statement

PRICE OF BEET

There is no dispute about the price of beet, which is based on costs of production Any differences which did occur during its determination were decided by arbitrators who found in favour of the BGA on three points and in favour of the Company on five points There was no dispute about the main item, which is cost of labour

Having accepted the arbitrators award, the price of beet of the 1957 crop is increased by 7/ a ton

In addition, the Company has offered a maximum bonus of 5/ a ton which will bring the price increase to 12/ if production is increased to target figures which, in the opinion of both parties, are attainable

The price of beet as published is that agreed by the BGA, and the Association calls on all members and on farmers generally to assist in reaching the target It wishes to demonstrate that given a fair price, as they are given in the case of the beet crop, farmers are able and willing to increase production

PRICE_OF_PRESSED_PULP

There is no increase in the price of pressed pulp taken by the grower as his basic ration of 8 cwt per ton of beet delivered Surplus pressed pulp will be offered to growers on an allocation basis at £1 per ton Any surplus not taken up by growers on allocation will be sold at 30/ a ton to growers who want it in addition to their allocation. Any remaining surplus will be sold at market value

The Association expects that growers will this year take up all pressed pulp available, and that they will, so far as convenient, use it instead of dried pulp so as to help the National economy by reducing imports of fuel oil or high volatile coal There has not been any dispute about

It is agreed that both parties acted throughout in good faith and tried to do then duty as they

AGREEMENT REACHED

At to day's meeting, agreement was reached that the injury which would be done to the interests of the farmers and the country generally makes it imperative that differences be reconciled and that all unite in a drive to secure increased pro duction, giving increased employment so urgently needed
