REDUCING FARMERS COSTS

The best modern machines do work of a higher standard than most old machines in use in Ireland They also work faster and in this way enable tillage operations to be done when soil and weather conditions are most favourable The result is earlier sowing and therefore more profitable crops More important still, when the machines have full economic employment they will reduce the cost of the work

So far as most Irish farmers are concerned, the main snag is that full economic employment is not available as the acreage which the machines are capable of doing is several times that cultivated by the average farmer It is not economic to invest money in a machine unless the amount of work available will enable it to earn the interest on capital and the cost of depreciation in addition to the cost of operation
