The origin of the currach is lost in the antiquity of history Essentially it has not altered over the years - a wooden ribbed framework covered by a waterproof coat It meets ideally the requirements demanded of it, it is sturdy enough to ride the stormiest seas and light enough to be carried ashore beyond the reach of the waves In skilful hands it is the safest of crafts on our wild Atlantic coast, An interesting variety of currach is a small oval type which was used on the Boyne In recent years one of these covered with cowhide, was built for the Hamburg Museum to replace one that was destroyed during the war. From Kerry to Donegal each district has its own variety of currach, the name may vary but the essential features of the boat remain the same,
