

Along the West coast of Ireland, close to the sea, one comes across many small uncovered stone enclosures These were Kelp Kilns in the days when kelp was extensively burned for its iodine content. The seaweed was gathered in deep water by men using scythes and rakes with handles up to 20 feet long. It was then dried on stone stands and carried by the women and children in creels to the kilns. The strong dense smoke which drifted far inland proclaimed to the countryside that kelp was being burned. Modern techniques have supplanted this method of lodine production and this once flourishing industry is now dead. the only traces left being the abandoned kilns. The seaweed however, is still highly prized by the local farmers who regard it as an excellent manure for all crops particularly potatoes in recent years it is increasingly used in the production of plastics
