Bulláns or basin stones are artificial holes in large boulders often found near old raths or monasteries. Their origin and function are uncertain. Some hold that they had a religious significance, others that they were essentially practical and were used to grind grain on the mortar and pestle principle. In later times the water which collected in these holes was considered to possess special curative qualities and until recently offerings of coins were often left in them Small stones lying in these cups were sometimes used as "cursing stones" and the invocation of the curse was regarded as a serious matter. In the 19th century a Co Clare farmer who was charged with assault by a beggar-woman, pleaded successfully before a Magistrate that she threatened "to turn the cursing stones of Kilmoon" against him for not giving her alms,
