BANISH BARBERRY AND BLACK STEM RUST

Black Stem Rust causes heavy losses in wheat. This disease spreads from the Common Barberrry shrub to cereal crops in the early summer.

You can prevent Black Stem Rust in cereals by destroying all plants of the Common Barberrry now.

The following points will help you to identify the Common Barberrry

- Leaves have spiny edges and branches have thorns arranged in groups of three
Outer bark is grey, inner bark is bright yellow
If unchecked, the plant grows into a large bush, 10 feet or so in height, and produces bunches of long, bright red berries in the Autumn

If you have any difficulty in distinguishing Common Barberrry (Berberis Vulgaris) from harmless ornamental species of Barberrry ask your Agricultural Instructor or Parish Agent to help you

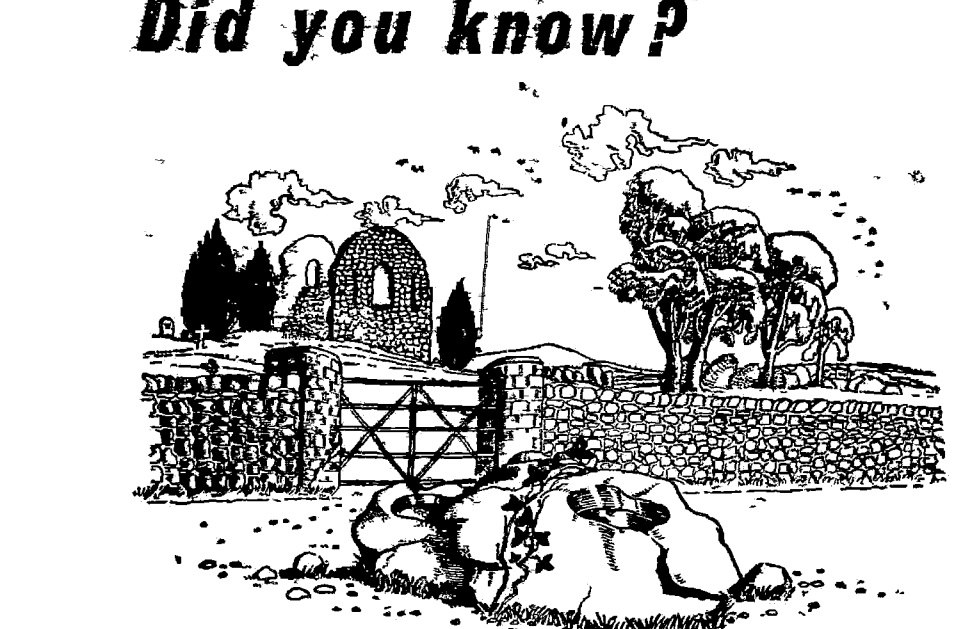
