A BUSY WEEK END
A bare month will bring us into what is expected to be the busiest week-end in Dungarvan life-times when tens of thousands of traditional musicians and supporters from every part of Ireland will take over the Old Bore and its environs for their annual Fleadh.

The race will commence and end each day in Clonmel with circuits of 70, 130 and 100 miles being made by the cyclists. The first day's circuit commencing at Clonmel will pass through Ardinnan, Clonbeg, Dungarvan, Carrick-on-Suir and end at Clonmel.

THE BEARDED SENATORS
